(CAP. 86)

THE FORESTRY (TAMA FOREST RESERVE)
ORDER-IN-COUNCIL 1928

ORDER

This Order may be cited as the Forestry (Forest Reserve) (Tama) Order.

2. The lands specified in the Schedule hereto shall be a forest reserve.

3. The natives of the Sando and Nimi Yema Chiefdoms in the Kono District of the South-Eastern Province of the Protectorate shall be entitled at all times to enter the forest reserve without fee, let or hindrance for the purpose of collecting the fruits of the oil-palm (*elaeis guineensis*), banana (*Musa sapientum*), plaintain (*Musa paradisiaca*) and kola (*Cola acuminata*) where the above plants at present exist and occur naturally, tapping the trees of the species *Raphia vinifera* (palm-wine tree) and the taking of palm-wine from them, hunting and fishing, gathering honey, taking poles and lianas for their own building requirements, subject to the permission of the Conservator of Forests, and on licence to fell timber.

THE SCHEDULE

Commencing at boundary cairn No. 1, situate on the Safinia-Mafildu road, 200 yards south-east of the village of Safinia, Nieni Chiefdom, Koinadugu District, which cairn is also a boundary cairn between Nieni and Sando Chiefdoms; thence on a magnetic bearing of 60 degrees to boundary cairn No. 2, distant 2,766 yards; thence down the right bank of the River Bagbe to where together with the river Bafi it becomes the river Sewa to boundary cairn No. 3, situate about 5,000 yards down-stream from where the stream Wetui empties into the Sewa from the west, and 1,000 yards up-stream from the Sewama-Wokoa ferry, the distance down-stream from boundary cairn No. 2 to boundary cairn No. 3, being about 50,200 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 270 degrees for a distance of 10,166 yards to boundary cairn No. 4, situate on the left bank of the river Falima; thence up-stream along the left bank of the river Falima for a distance of about 6,700 yards to boundary cairn No. 5, situate at the confluence of the river Fenka with the river Falima; thence up-stream along the left bank of the river Fenka for a distance of 2,514 yards to boundary cairn No. 6, situate on the right bank where it is joined by the stream Tonkobore; thence on a magnetic bearing of 355 degrees to boundary cairn No. 7, distant 1,110 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 25 degrees to boundary cairn No. 8, distant 1,392 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 6½ degrees to boundary cairn No. 9, distant 6,320 yards; thence up-stream along the left bank of the river Birco to boundary cairn No. 10 distant 7,000 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 50 degrees to boundary cairn No. 11, distant 7,370 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 38 degrees to boundary cairn No. 12, distant 4,712 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 37 degrees to boundary cairn No. 13, distant 2,880 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 40 degrees to boundary cairn No. 1, distant 2,466 yards, already described.

But excluding from the area above described the following farmlands:-

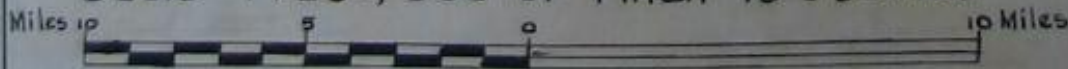
- (1) BAGWEMA-FORIGBOMA-DELO.- Commencing at boundary cairn No.14, situate at the mouth of the stream Sengi which empties into the river Sewa at a point about 2,000 yards down-stream from the confluence of the rivers Bagbe and Bafi; thence up the stream Sengi to boundary cairn No.15, distant 366 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 270 degrees to boundary cairn No.16, distant 1,222 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 360 degrees to boundary cairn No.17, distant 9,146 yards; thence along the Samaia-Delo road in an easterly direction to boundary cairn No.18, situate on the right bank of the river Bagbe, distant 1,433 yards; thence down the right bank of the river Bagbe and the river Sewa to boundary cairn No.14 described above.
- (2) TIKONKO.- Commencing at boundary cairn No.6, already described and proceeding up the right bank of the river Fenka for a distance of 2,260 yards to boundary cairn No.19; thence on a magnetic bearing of 40 degrees to boundary cairn No.20, distant 1,733 yards; thence down the stream Bandatigula to boundary cairn No.21, distant 1,300 yards, situate at the confluence of the Bandatigula with the stream Tutambeh; thence down the stream Tutambeh to boundary cairn No.22, distant 1,100 yards, situate at the confluence of the stream Tutambeh with the stream Tonkoboro; thence down the stream Tonkoboro to boundary cairn No. 6, distant 3,600 yards, already described.
- (3) BANDIA-KINDEA.- Commencing at boundary cairn No.23, situate at the point where the Sumbaria-Mafidu road crosses the stream Moanki 133 yards eastwards to the village of Bandia, and proceeding thence up the stream Moanki to boundary cairn No.24, distant 433 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 190 degrees to boundary cairn No.25, distant 333 yards; thence on a westerly direction along the Mafildu-Sumbaria road for a distance of 390 yards to boundary cairn No.26, situate on an unnamed stream; thence down this stream for a distance of 750 yards to its junction with the stream Moanki, marked by boundary cairn No.27; thence for a distance of 850 yards down the stream Moanki to its junction with the stream Kanigba, marked by boundary cairn No.28; thence down the stream Kanigba for a distance of 2,600 yards to boundary cairn No.29, situate on the right bank of the river Bagbe; thence up along the right bank of the river Bagbe to boundary cairn No.30, distant about 7,000 yards, and situate on the Mafildu-Sumbaria road; thence along this road in a westerly direction for a distance of 5,590 yards to boundary cairn No.23, described above.
