THE FORESTRY (TONKOLI FOREST RESERVE)

ORDER-IN-COUNCIL 1926

ORDER

This Order may be cited as the Forestry (Forest Reserve) (Tonkoli) Order.

2. The lands specified in the Schedule hereto shall be a forest reserve.

3. The native of the Nienni, the Kaliang, and the Kwiki Fulawusu Chiefdoms in the Koinadugu District in the Northern Province of the Protectorate shall be entitled at all times to enter the forest reserve without fee, let or hindrance, for the purpose of hunting and fishing, gathering fruits, palm products and honey, collecting building material and, on licence, to fell timber.

SCHEDULE

Commencing at boundary stone No. 1, which is situate on the Safinia-Mafidu Road 200 yards south-east of the village of Safinia in the Nienni Chiefdom, Koinadugu District, in the Northern Province, thence on a magnetic bearing of 60 degrees to boundary stone No. 2, distant 2,766 yards; thence up the right bank of the River Bagwe for a distance of about 21,400 yards to boundary stone No. 3, thence on a magnetic bearing of 270 degrees to boundary stone No. 4, distant 6,136 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 360 degrees to boundary stone No. 5, distant 2,550 yards; thence along the Kuluwulala Konia Road in a northerly direction for a distance of about 3,362 yards to boundary stone No. 6; thence on a magnetic bearing of 270 degrees to boundary stone No. 7, distant 3,900 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 234 degrees to boundary stone No. 8, distant 733 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 360 degrees to boundary stone No. 9, distant 646 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 270 degrees to boundary stone No.10, distant 10,900 yards; thence down the River Pampana for a distance of about 27,000 yards to boundary stone No.11; thence on a magnetic bearing of 120 degrees to boundary stone No.12, distant 9,011 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 180 degrees to boundary stone No.13, distant 2,619 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 110 degrees to boundary stone No.14, distant 4,695 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 60 degrees to boundary stone No.15, distant 866 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 120 degrees to boundary stone No.16, distant 2,261 yards; thence down the river Falima for a distance of about 3,000 to boundary stone No.17; thence on a magnetic bearing of 80 degrees to boundary stone No.18, distant 4,296 yards; thence up the stream Kalisaye for a distance of 700 yards to boundary stone No.19, situate at stream divide north-east of Porbalia village; thence down an unnamed stream for a distance of about 600 yards to boundary stone No.20; thence on a magnetic bearing of 90 degrees to boundary stone No.21, distant 4,920 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 42 degrees to boundary stone No.22, distant 830 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 55 degrees to boundary stone No.23, distant 2,666 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 85 degrees to boundary stone No.24, distant 1,100 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 30 degrees to boundary stone No.25, distant 633 yards, thence on a magnetic bearing of 60 degrees to boundary stone No.26, distant 377 yards; thence on a

magnetic bearing of 90 degrees to boundary stone No. 27, distant 3,777 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 40 degrees to boundary stone No. 1, distant 2,766 yards.

The following areas shall be excluded from the forest reserve:-

- (1) WOROMBAIA FARMLANDS. Commencing at boundary stone No. 1, on the left bank of the river Kiro about half-a-mile south of the village, thence on a magnetic bearing of 222 degrees to boundary stone No. 2, distant 100 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 310 degrees to boundary stone No. 3, distant 445 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 270 degrees to boundary stone No. 4, distant 678 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 360 degrees to boundary stone No. 5, distant 646 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 260 degrees to boundary stone No. 6, distant 400 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 330 degrees to boundary stone No. 7, distant 110 yards; thence ~~down~~ stream along the river Tembelinka to its junction with the river Kiro, thence up stream along the river Kiro to boundary stone No. 1, described above.
- (2) BAMAIA FARMLANDS. Commencing at boundary stone No. 1, on the right bank of the stream Birili about one mile south-east of the village of Bamaia; thence down stream to its junction with the river Pampana marked boundary stone No. 2; thence up stream along the river Pampana for a distance of about 1,400 yards to boundary stone No. 3, at the mouth of the stream Dalleh; thence up stream along the Dalleh for a distance of 413 yards to boundary stone No. 4; thence on a magnetic bearing of 200 degrees to boundary stone No. 1, described above.
- (3) BALIA FARMLANDS. Commencing at boundary stone No. 1, on the Balia-Bamaia Road, distant 211 yards from the village of Balia, on a magnetic bearing of 330 degrees; thence on a magnetic bearing of 230 degrees to boundary stone No. 2, distant 1,057 yards; thence up the stream Bonki to boundary stone No. 3; thence on a magnetic bearing of 70 degrees to boundary stone No. 4, distant 1,867 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 360 degrees to boundary stone No. 5, distant 1,050 yards; thence down along the stream Mayou to boundary stone No. 6, distant about 933 yards; thence along the Bamaia-Balia Road to boundary stone No. 1, described above.
- (4) TONKOLI FARMLANDS. Commencing at boundary stone No. 1, about one-third of a mile north-west of the village of Tonkoli and just north of the Tonkoli-Sekurella Road; thence on a magnetic bearing of 190 degrees to boundary stone No. 2, distant 1,907 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 40 degrees to boundary stone No. 3, distant 1,922 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 315 degrees to boundary stone No. 1, distant 1,097 yards, described above.

- (5) **BALISILAIYA FARMLANDS.** Commencing at boundary stone No. 1, about one-third of a mile north-west of the village Balisilaiya on a small unnamed stream; thence down stream to its junction with the river Falima marked by boundary stone No. 2, distant about 600 yards; thence down the river Falima to boundary stone No. 3, distant about 3,100 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 20 degrees to boundary stone No. 4, distant 1,260 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 120 degrees to boundary stone No. 1, described above, distant 160 yards.
- (6) **LANAKORO VILLAGE.** Commencing at boundary stone No. 1, on the Lanakoro-Bandankoro Road about 100 yards north-east of Lanakoro Village, thence on a magnetic bearing of 130 degrees to boundary stone No. 2, distant 133 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 220 degrees to boundary stone No. 3, distant 200 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 310 degrees to boundary stone No. 4, distant 133 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 40 degrees to boundary stone No. 1, distant 200 yards; described above.
- (7) **LANAKORO FARMLANDS.** Commencing at boundary stone No. 1, on the left bank of the stream Bofaltinte about two-thirds of a mile north of the village of Lanakoro; thence on a magnetic bearing of 65 degrees to boundary stone No. 2, distant 1,241 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 150 degrees to boundary stone No. 3, distant 623 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 270 degrees to boundary stone No. 4, distant 438 yards; thence down along the river Bassikonte to its junction with the stream Bofaltinte to boundary stone No. 1, described above.
- (8) **BANDANKORO FARMLANDS.** Commencing at boundary stone No. 1, about 1,600 yards west of the village of Bandankoro and on the left bank of the stream Mariyi; thence down the stream Mariyi for a distance of about 3,100 yards to boundary stone No. 2; thence on a magnetic bearing of 60 degrees to boundary stone No. 3, distant 1,512 yards; thence down the stream Dianiwalli for a distance of about 1,933 yards to boundary stone No. 4; thence on a magnetic bearing of 20 degrees to boundary stone No. 5, distant 3,066 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 23 degrees to boundary stone No. 6, distant 566 yards; thence up the stream Masuru for a distance of about 2,500 yards to boundary stone No. 7; thence along the Kindia-Bandankoro Road in a southerly direction for a distance of about 1,123 yards to boundary stone No. 8; thence on a magnetic bearing of 240 degrees to boundary stone No. 1, described above, distant 2,192 yards.

- (9) KINDIA FARMLANDS. Commencing at boundary stone No. 1, on the left bank of a small stream about 200 yards north-west of the village of Kindia; thence for a distance of 400 yards to its junction with the river Heriko marked by boundary stone No. 2; thence up along the river Heriko for a distance of 933 yards to boundary stone No. 3; thence on a magnetic bearing of 290 degrees for a distance of 407 yards to boundary stone No. 1, described above.
- (10) FARAKORO FARMLANDS. Commencing at boundary stone No. 1, on the Farakoro-Kumala Road, distant 15 yards from the village of Farakoro; thence along the Farakoro-Kumala Road in a northerly direction for a distance of about 715 yards to boundary stone No. 2; thence on a magnetic bearing of 90 degrees to boundary stone No. 3, distant 1,003 yards; thence down the stream Dalleh for a distance of 375 yards to its junction with the river Yimi marked by boundary stone No. 4; thence down left bank of river Yimi to boundary stone No. 6; thence on a magnetic bearing of 180 degrees to boundary stone No. 7, distant 100 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 270 degrees to boundary stone No. 8, distant 770 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 15 degrees to boundary stone No. 9, distant 156 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 350 degrees to boundary stone No. 10, distant 437 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 20 degrees to boundary stone No. 1, distant 230 yards, described above.
- (11) JUMBURORO VILLAGE. Commencing at boundary stone No. 1, situate on left bank of river Yanneh, about 200 yards north-east of village of Jumbukoro; thence on a magnetic bearing of 90 degrees to boundary stone No. 2, distant 319 yards; thence down a small stream to its junction with the river Yanneh marked by boundary stone No. 3, distant about 800 yards; thence up the left bank of the river Yanneh to boundary stone No. 1, described above and distant about 900 yards.
- (12) JUMBUKORO FARMLANDS. Commencing at boundary stone No. 4, on the right bank of river Yanneh, about a quarter-of-a-mile down stream from boundary stone No. 3, already described above; thence down the river Yanneh to boundary stone No. 5, distant about 1,400 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 255 degrees to boundary stone No. 6, distant 112 yards; thence up the stream Hergo to boundary stone No. 7, distant about 1,167 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 40 degrees to boundary stone No. 8, distant 681 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 20 degrees to boundary stone No. 9, distant 108 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 30 degrees to boundary stone No. 4, distant 433 yards, described above.

(13) FANGOIA AND KAMARO FARMLANDS. Commencing at boundary stone No. 1, on the left bank of the river Yanneh, about half-a-mile east of the village of Fangoia; thence up the river Yanneh for a distance of about 8,500 yards to where it is joined on the left bank by the stream Wullyi and marked by boundary stone No. 2; thence up the stream Wullyi for a distance of about 300 yards to boundary stone No. 3; thence on a magnetic bearing of 80 degrees to boundary stone No. 4, distant 4,000 yards; thence down the stream Birco to boundary stone No. 5, distant about 1,000 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 180 degrees to boundary stone No. 1, described above, distant 3,719 yards.

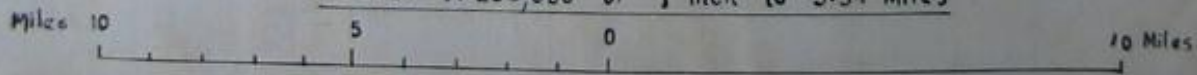
(14) SAFINAIA FARMLANDS. Commencing at boundary stone No. 1 at the intersection of the Safinaia-Bangbaria Road with the stream Bonka, about 200 yards southwest of the village of Safinaia; thence along the Safinaia and Bangbaria Road for a distance of about 2,533 yards to boundary stone No. 2, thence on a magnetic bearing of 320 degrees to boundary stone No. 3, distant 1,013 yards; thence on a magnetic bearing of 215 degrees to boundary stone No. 4, distant 2,829 yards; thence down the stream Bonka to boundary stone No. 1, described above, distant about 2,333 yards.
