Letter from America

The 100 different answers to the quiz all relate to the United States of America and the clues are arranged in a significant order. For this quiz, the number of letters in each answer is not given with the corresponding clues, but, if the number of words in the answer is more than 1, then that number is shown in brackets at the end of the clue. The proceeds of the quiz will support the work of Open Arms Malawi, which runs transition homes in Malawi for infants, most of whom have been orphaned because of AIDS. There are four prizes, all gift tokens. Three of them, for £20, £15 and £10, will be awarded to the three most accurate entries received by 6pm on Saturday, $10^{\rm th}$ April 2021. The fourth prize, also for £10, will be won by an entrant who achieves the average, median score. Any ties will be resolved by the quality of the tie-breaker clues submitted by those entrants.
