Cost of Road Crashes (Non Metropolitan Authorities) 2011-13

Non-metropolitan authorities have been defined where the rural population accounts for at least 25% of the total.

All fatal and serious crashes between 2011-13 have been assigned crash costs from the “total value of prevention” costs defined by the Department for Transport.

Economic loss per capita is the total economic loss per authority divided by the total population.

Economic loss per travel is the total economic loss per authority divided by the volume of traffic.

The colours given in the table are ordered from lowest in green to highest in red.
