	174 words in passage 157 ÷ 174 = 90% accuracy
<u>Notes:</u>	Several words were decoded with closer analysis - i.e. explained, important, basement. He omitted the second line on page 2 and was directed to go back to it (so - start over). I think he was just anxious to read Arthur's story. We discussed the meaning of dull. He understood what boring meant, but didn't recognize the word. Most miscues did not interrupt meaning. He understood and enjoyed the story. He talked about caring for his dog and about friends giving you ideas for stories.
