Earhearts known destination was Howland Island, 2,556 miles away. The USGGC Itasca was assigned at Howland Island to guide and communicate with Amelia's Electra 10. Sources noted that Earheart could not anderstand the navy ship

The navy ship could hear Amelia and Fred but could not respond. Amelia could hear them trying to speck but only heard heavy static.
