

One-Point Linear Perspective



Directions: Apply the following steps to create a one-point perspective drawing:

1. Draw a horizon line across the surface of the paper.
2. Center a square or rectangular shape above or below the horizon line.
3. Mark the vanishing point on the horizon line.
4. Use a ruler to draw two lines called **orthogonal lines** that connect the vertical edge of the shape closest to the vanishing point.
5. Mark the depth of the shape by drawing a parallel line that connects the two orthogonal lines that originate from the vanishing point.
6. Remove the orthogonal lines outside of the box form.
