Materials



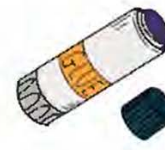
Paper



Scissors

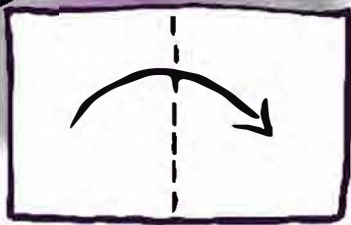


Coloring utensils



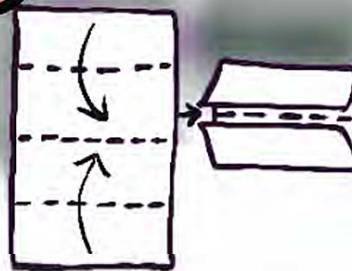
Glue

1



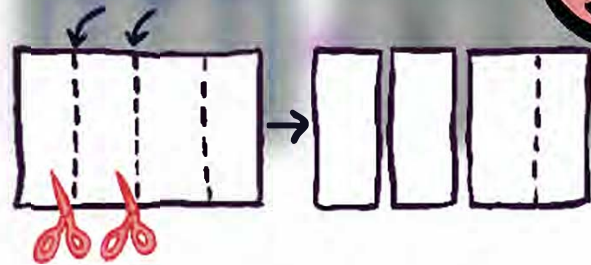
Fold your piece of paper in half horizontally or "hamburger style".

2



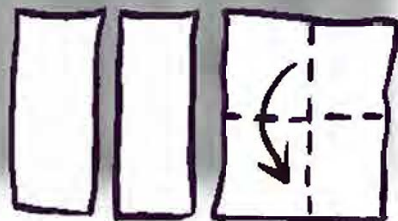
Fold the top and bottom of the paper inwards to the middle crease
(You should have four folds).

3



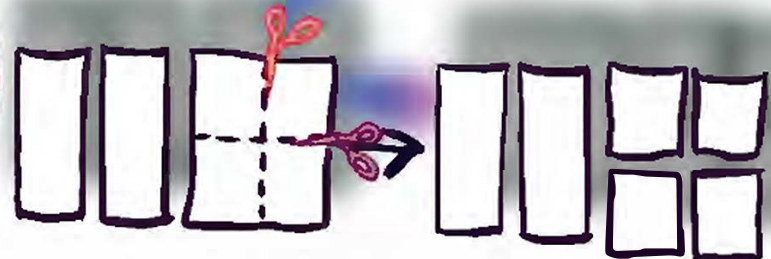
Cut the middle and left crease off
(You should have three pieces of paper).

Fold the now, 9"x12" piece of paper in half "hamburger style" or horizontally.

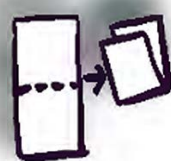


Cut along the creases on the 9" x 12" paper
(You should have six pieces of paper in total, as shown).

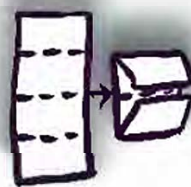

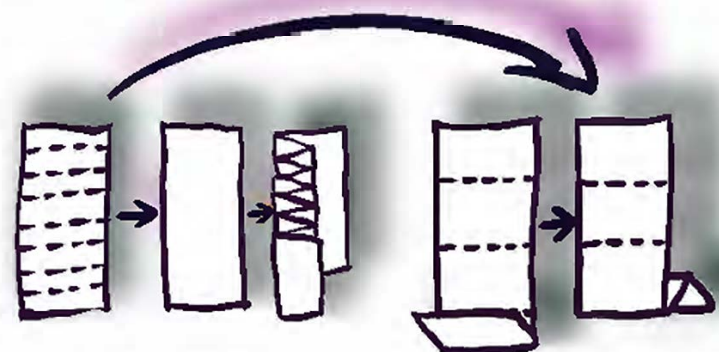
Take your two long strips of paper...



and fold them in half.

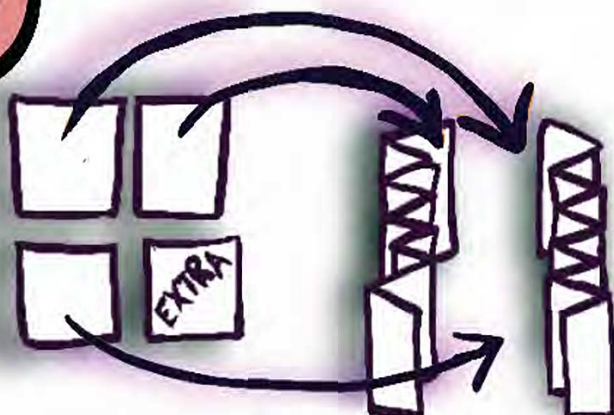


Fold the top and bottom edges of the paper to the middle crease.

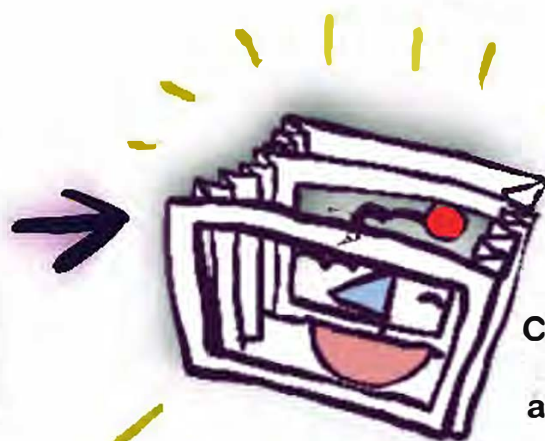


Fold towards the creases in an "accordion style" fashion. Accordion style is folding inwards and then outwards, alternating directions of folds.

Decorate with a foreground, middle ground, and background using your extra small bits of paper.



Finishing Touches!

Cut out the backgrounds of your extra sheets prior to gluing into the accordion folds. Ensure to add cutout silhouettes and figures and objects!!
