#### Sociolinguistic Corner

#### جَه - ييجي

As is the case in English and many other languages, the equivalent of the verb “to come” in Arabic has an irregular conjugation. While you will notice some patterning with the conjugations of other verbs, it is best at this stage to think of this verb as irregular and to remember the conjugation for each of the eight pronouns.

Listen to your teacher or the audio recording for the pronunciation of مصري جَه/ييجي and فصحي جَاء/ييجي and try to imitate the correct pronunciation as closely as possible.
