Important dates (all programs, campuses, admission types)

August 1, 2021	Fall 2022 applications open
March 1, 2022	Admission decision notification begins. Transfer and regional campus applications submitted after this date – students will be notified of the admission decision approximately 4 to 6 weeks after the application is complete
May 1, 2022	Deposit deadline – admitted students must pay their enrollment deposit to secure their place at UConn. Students with offers issued close to or after this date have 2 weeks to pay their deposit
August 1, 2022	I-20 request deadline
August 29, 2022	Fall classes start.

December 1	All campuses	Priority application deadline for scholarship consideration
	Storrs	Special Programs (Medicine, Dental Medicine, Law, Education)
January 15	Storrs	Most degrees in School of Fine Arts* (except Music and Puppetry)

January 15	Storrs	Official application deadline – higher chance of admission and getting application completed in time
February 1	Storrs	Kaplan deadline extension – UConn will still accept Kaplan applications up to this date, but likelihood of admission and scholarships has reduced by this point
February 15	Storrs	All supporting materials must be fully submitted to UConn (i.e. application status must be complete in the portal)
March 15	UConn Stamford	If university housing is required
May 1	Regional campuses	UConn Stamford – if university housing is not required; UConn Avery Point, UConn Hartford, UConn Waterbury

* These programs require an additional submission through Slideroom.

Note: please allow several business days for document processing. All documents must be received by the application deadline to be considered on time. Late applications and applications not completed by the deadline will be reviewed on a space-available basis.

April 1	Storrs	Most majors: Allied Health Sciences, Agriculture & Natural Resources, Animal Science, Applied Resource Economics, Environmental Sciences, Environmental Studies, Landscape Architecture, Natural Resources, Nutritional Sciences, Pathobiology, Sustainable Plant & Soil Systems, School of Business, School of Engineering, Art History, Theatre Studies, College of Liberal Arts & Sciences, Pharmacy Studies
May 1	Regional campuses	UConn Stamford – if university housing is not required; UConn Avery Point, UConn Hartford, UConn Waterbury
