What is EES?

If your IELTS level is too low for the 2-term International Year One, you can take a course of up to 4 terms including Extended English and Skills (EES), such as the 2.5 and 3-term options above. You can study a course that includes EES if you have at least UKVI IELTS 4.0 in all skills.
