The D'Amore-McKim School of Business MS in International Business (MSIB) is designed to provide talented, driven students like you with the exposure to the global business environment that will distinguish you in the workforce.

This program can be completed in one year of full-time study or two years of part-time study while providing the opportunity to live and learn in the heart of Boston; home to one of the largest, most vibrant, and highly-regarded global marketplaces in the U.S. and the economic and cultural hub of New England.

The curriculum is designed to meet the needs of young professionals with bachelor degrees in business or business-related programs providing them with opportunities to connect business concepts to real-world issues. Twenty-one credits are graduate business courses and six elective credits may be taken in Sociology or Political Science. Three credits are from a 10-day International Field Study course in China, Dubai/Abu Dhabi, Peru/Chile, or Turkey/Greece that offers immersion in the practices and cultures of these markets.

Graduates of this master's program will be culturally sensitive with an international orientation, business acumen, and the analytic skills needed to best prepare you to navigate an increasingly interconnected and fast-paced world.
