



From Spring 2022, Pace University's English Language Institute (ELI) is relaunching its Intensive English Program. Kaplan's international applicants can now raise their English proficiency on Pace's campus.

Program key facts

Who is it for? undergraduate or graduate applicants with English levels below the 3-semester Global Pathways program requirement.

Also suitable for:

- Sponsored students (e.g. by SACM) who don't meet the English requirement for a degree, and whose sponsorship does not cover the Pathways program.
- Directly admitted students who would like a short course to refresh their language skills, prior to the start of their degree.
- Students who must transfer from a U.S. institution right away to maintain their F-1 student visa status
- Students who wish to move from Kaplan Languages to ELI

Location: New York City campus

Intakes and session length: 2 sessions per semester. Starts in January, March, September, and October (session length 7 weeks); starts in May and July (session length 6 weeks).

Entry requirements

English score: Applicants must submit an English test score and will be advised of their expected IEP duration. However, all students take the ELI Placement Exam when they arrive on campus to determine which level of IEP they join. Students with the following scores are suitable for IEP:

- Below TOEFL 61 (or equivalent) for undergraduate pathway applicants
- Below TOEFL 55 (or equivalent) for Seidenberg School graduate pathway applicants
- Below TOEFL 65 (or equivalent) for Dyson College or School of Education graduate pathway applicants
- Below TOEFL 70 (or equivalent) for Lubin School graduate pathway applicants

Academic criteria: Students must be conditionally admitted into the Global Pathways program leading to their intended progression degree, e.g. they have met the academic entry requirements.

Program structure:

Levels: Advanced-beginner, Low-intermediate, High-Intermediate

Time in class: 4 Intensive English classes studied for 18 hours per week.

Courses:

- Conversation and Listening – 5 hours per week (2.5 with teacher and 2.5 self-paced)
- Grammar and Writing — 5 hours per week (2.5 with teacher and 2.5 self-paced)
- Reading and Vocabulary — 4 hours per week (2 with teacher and 2 self-paced)
- Social English in U.S. Academic Culture — 4 hours per week (2 with teacher and 2 self-paced)
- Foundations of English (advanced beginner and pre-intermediate levels only) – 15 hours per week (10 with teacher and 5 self-paced)

Progression to 3-semester Global Pathways

Duration in IEP: Students are expected to advance 0.5 or 1 ELI level for each IEP session. Students can join further IEP sessions, up to a maximum of 1 year, if necessary, to reach the Global Pathways entry requirement.

Progression criteria: Minimum B- (80%) final course grade and a level recommendation from course instructors.

Pace ELI level to be completed:

- Low Intermediate level for undergraduate pathway
- Low Intermediate level for Seidenberg graduate pathway
- High Intermediate level for Lubin, Dyson or Education graduate pathways
