Carved by students to mark the coronation of Edward VII in 1902.

St. Augustine established the first cathedral at Canterbury in 597. Rebuilt by the Normans in 1070, following a major fire.

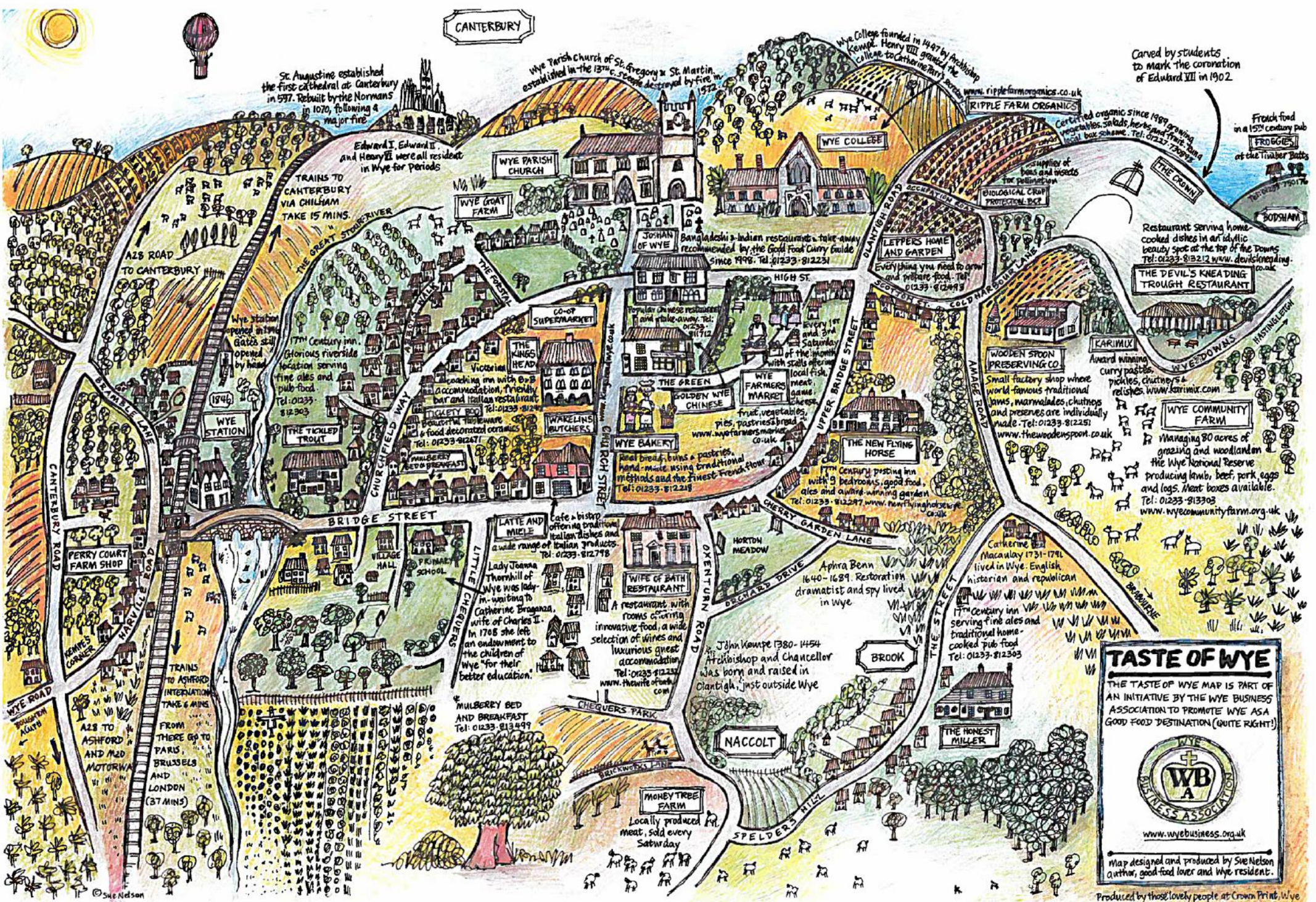
Wye Parish Church of St. Gregory & St. Martin, established in the 13th c. severe destroyed by fire in 1572.

Wye College founded in 1447 by Archbishop Kemp. Henry VIII granted the college to Catherine (1st) Howard.
