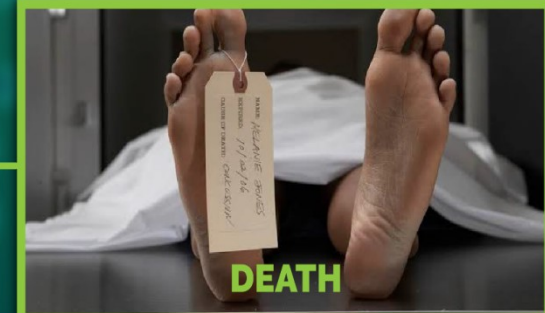

# Background

- **Kenya continues to battle the COVID-19 pandemic with cases steadily rising each day. Currently the number of COVID19 cases has risen to 2600 deaths with 79 deaths.**
- **For the past three months the Kenyan Government has implemented various measures aimed at ensuring that majority of Kenyans stay safe and protected. Some of these measures which include imposition of curfew, partial lockdowns, cessation of inter county movements and mandatory social/physical distancing and mask wearing have been perceived by certain quarters as perhaps too punitive and extreme with certain quarters and especially the business sector pushing for the return to normalcy in order to prevent the economy from eminent collapse.**
- **It's against this backdrop that following the lapse of the 21 day government measures the President among other things today reduced the curfew periodic from 5am -7pm to 4am – 9pm and ordered for the preparation of opening of schools from September**
- **Irrespective of circumstances, what is clear is that the Coronavirus/Covid-19 pandemic continues to test the capacities of both our socio-economic and healthcare systems. Kenyans have individually had to make extreme adjustments to their lives and modus operandi. It is against this background that Infotrak has conducted perception surveys garner the views of Kenyans on the COVID19. Our second wave of the Infotrak COVID19 poll which was conducted between 28<sup>th</sup> May and June 1<sup>st</sup> is out.**

<b>Who conducted &amp; sponsored the poll?</b>	The Poll was sponsored & conducted by Infotrak Research and Consulting
<b>Who paid for the poll?</b>	This is a syndicated Infotrak Poll funded by Infotrak
<b>When was the poll conducted?</b>	Between 28 <sup>th</sup> May – 2 <sup>nd</sup> June 2020
<b>How was the poll conducted?</b>	Interviews were conducted through Computer Assisted Telephone Interviews (CATI)
<b>What was the sample size?</b>	A target sample of 1200 respondents were interviewed to represent the Kenya adult population. The poll covered 24 out of the 47 counties in Kenya.
<b>What was the margin of error?</b>	±2.83% at 95% degree of confidence.
<b>What was the response rate?</b>	98% response rate.
<b>Weighting</b>	Poststratification weights were applied to the data.
<b>How was the sample designed?</b>	Using the KNBS publication on the 2019 Population Census as a sample frame the sample was designed using stratified multi stage cluster sampling with Probability Proportional to size.
<b>Data Analysis</b>	Data was processed and analyzed using SPSS version 26 statistical software

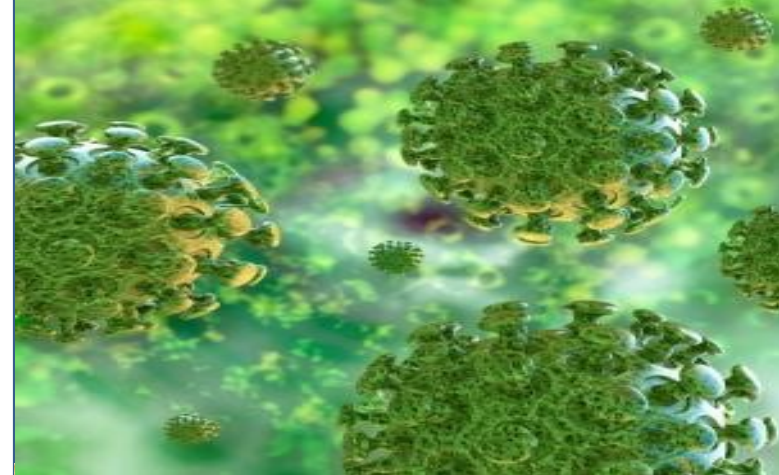

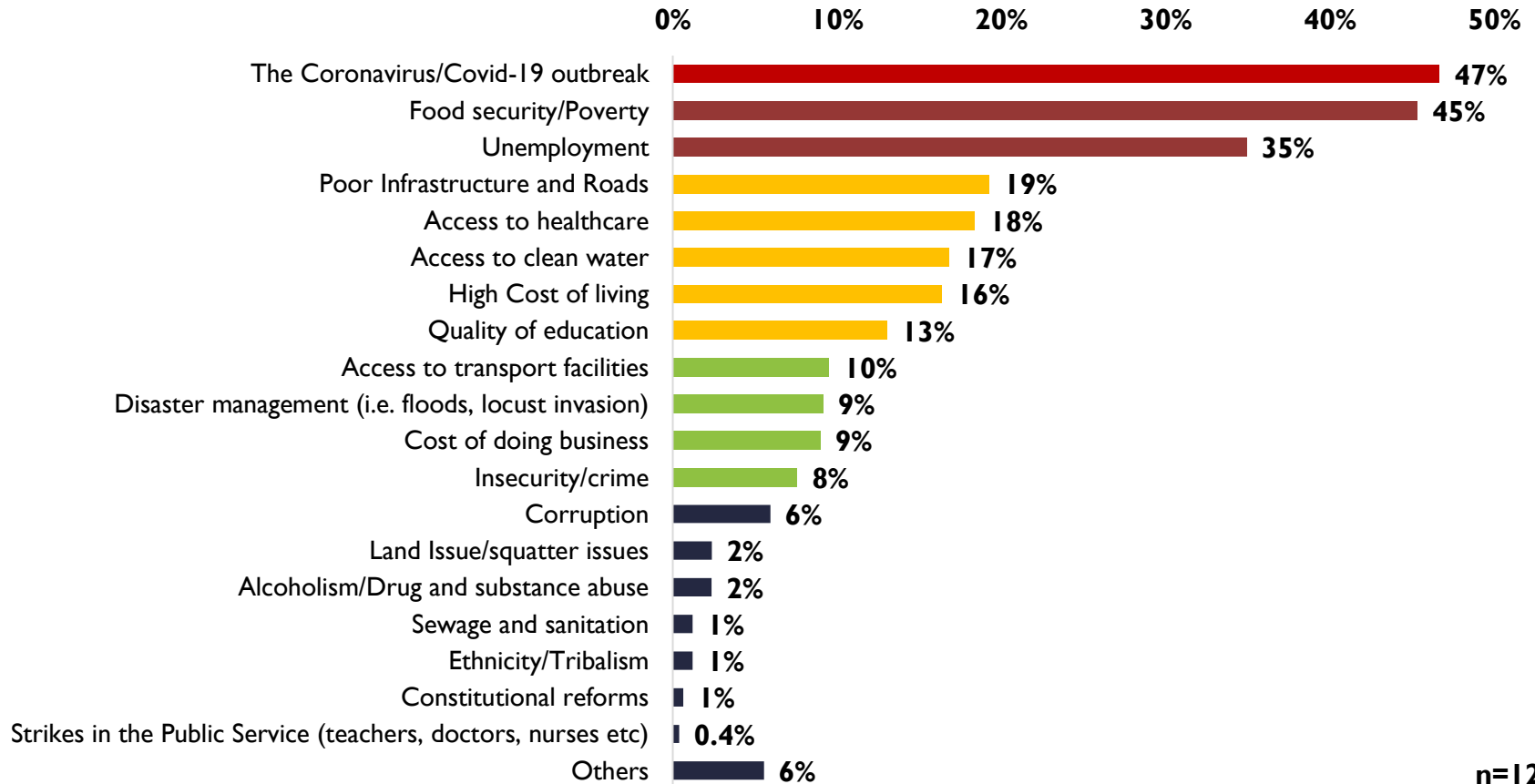

- Other issues that currently concern Kenyans are; reliable transport, cost of doing business, insecurity, disaster management ,corruption and alcohol/substance abuse

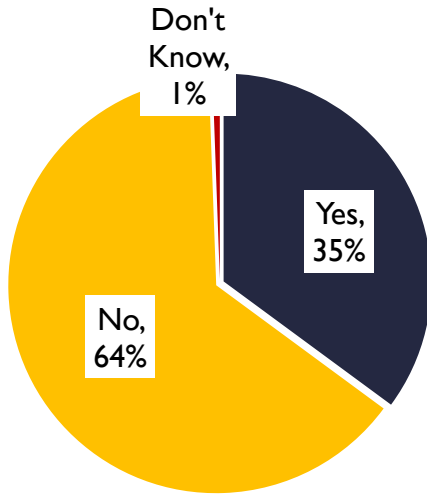

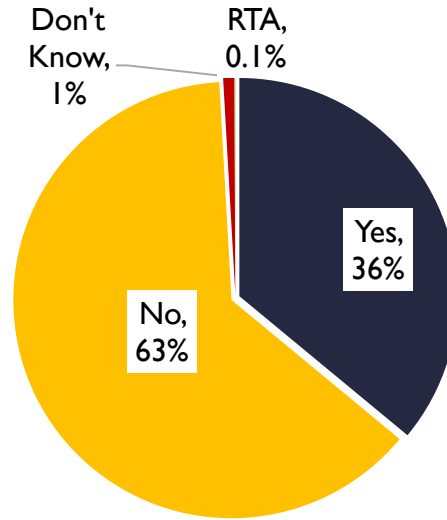

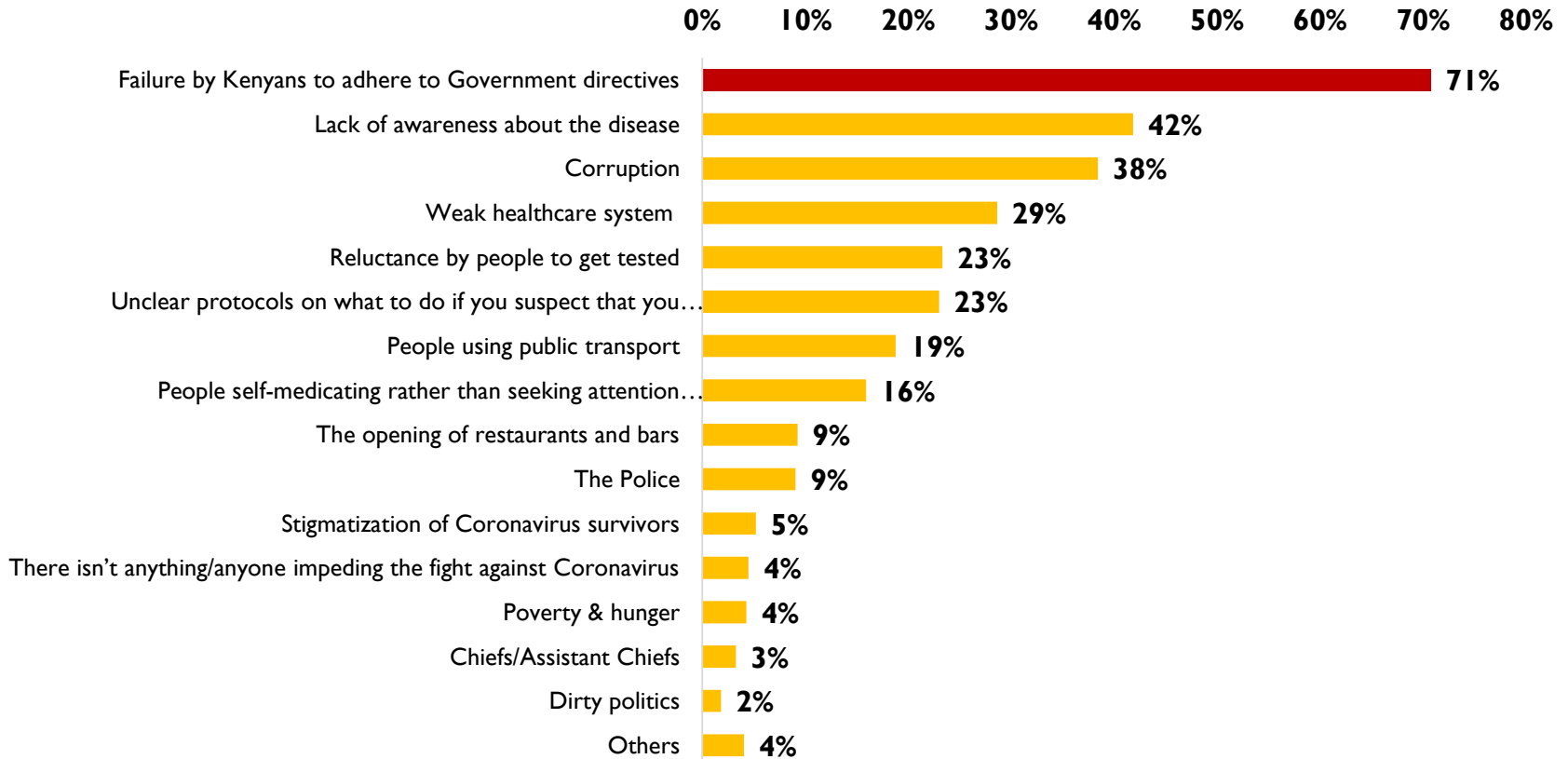
Which of the following statements best describe what you understand about the Coronavirus/COVID-19? It's better to take your family upcountry to protect them from the Coronavirus/COVID-19

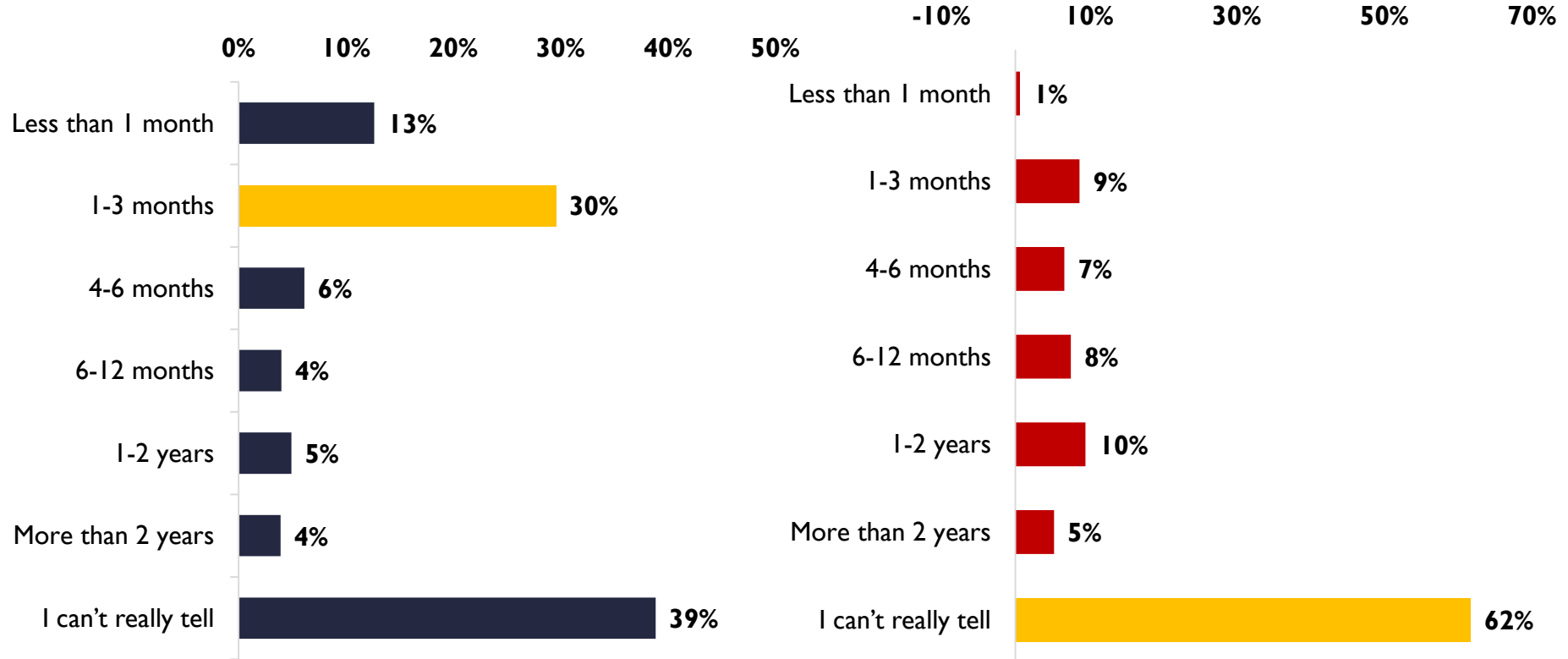

Wave 2: June 2020 N=1200

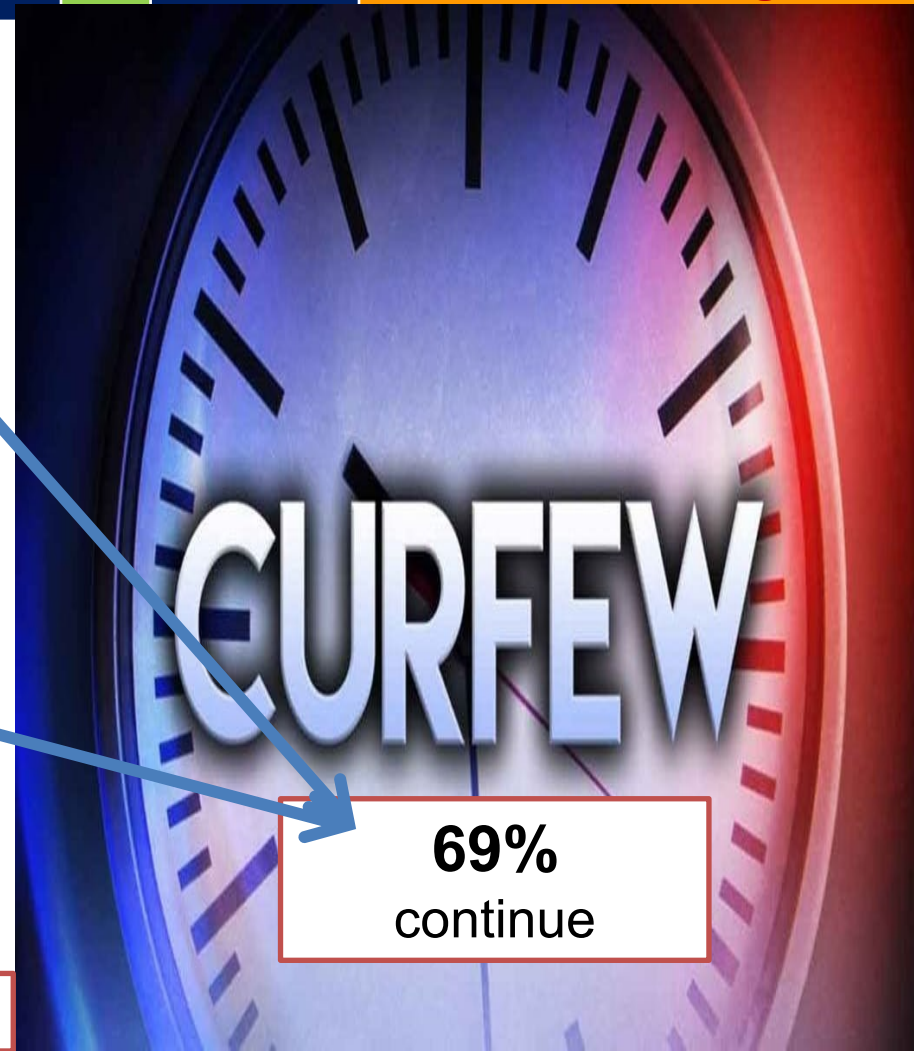
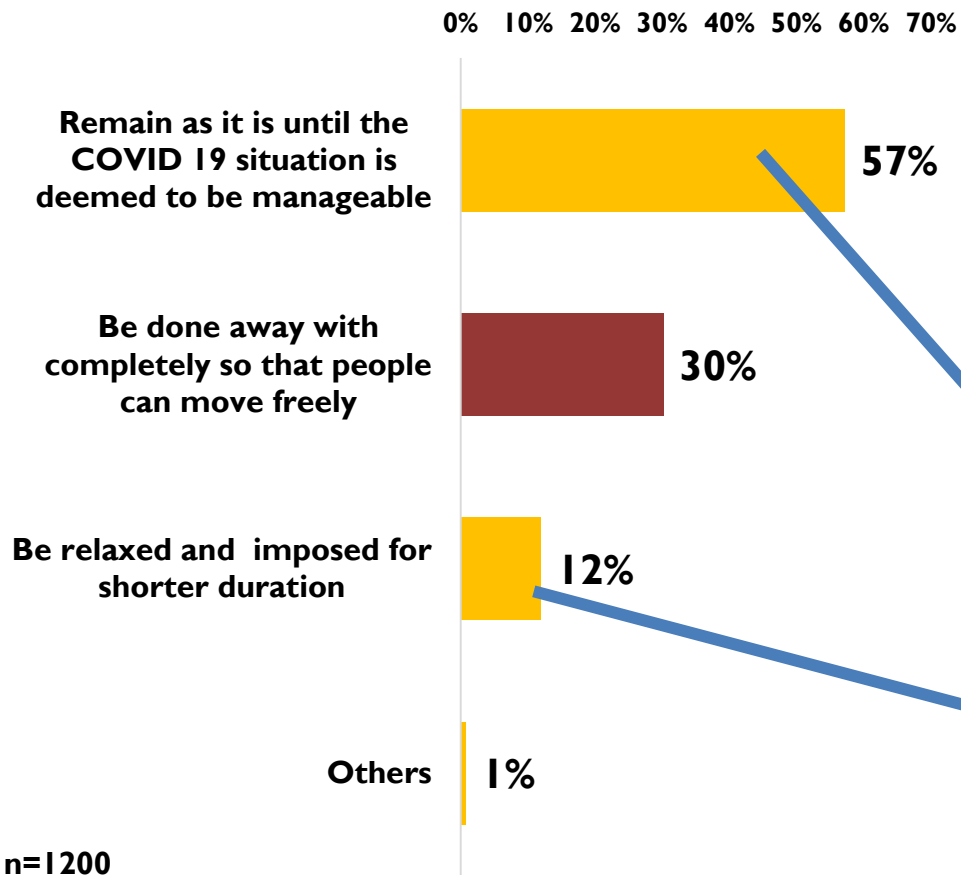


How long do you think it will take for things to normalize in Kenya?

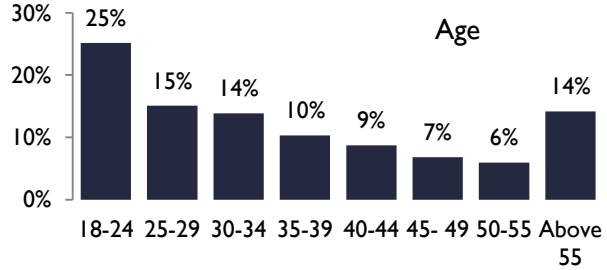

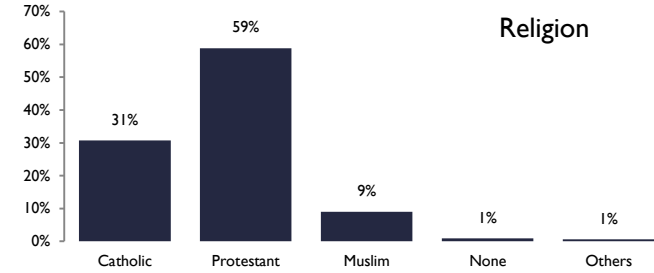

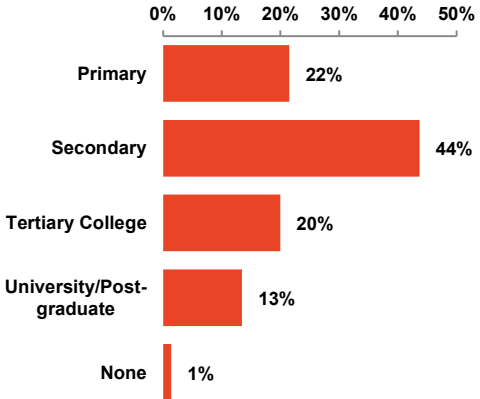
