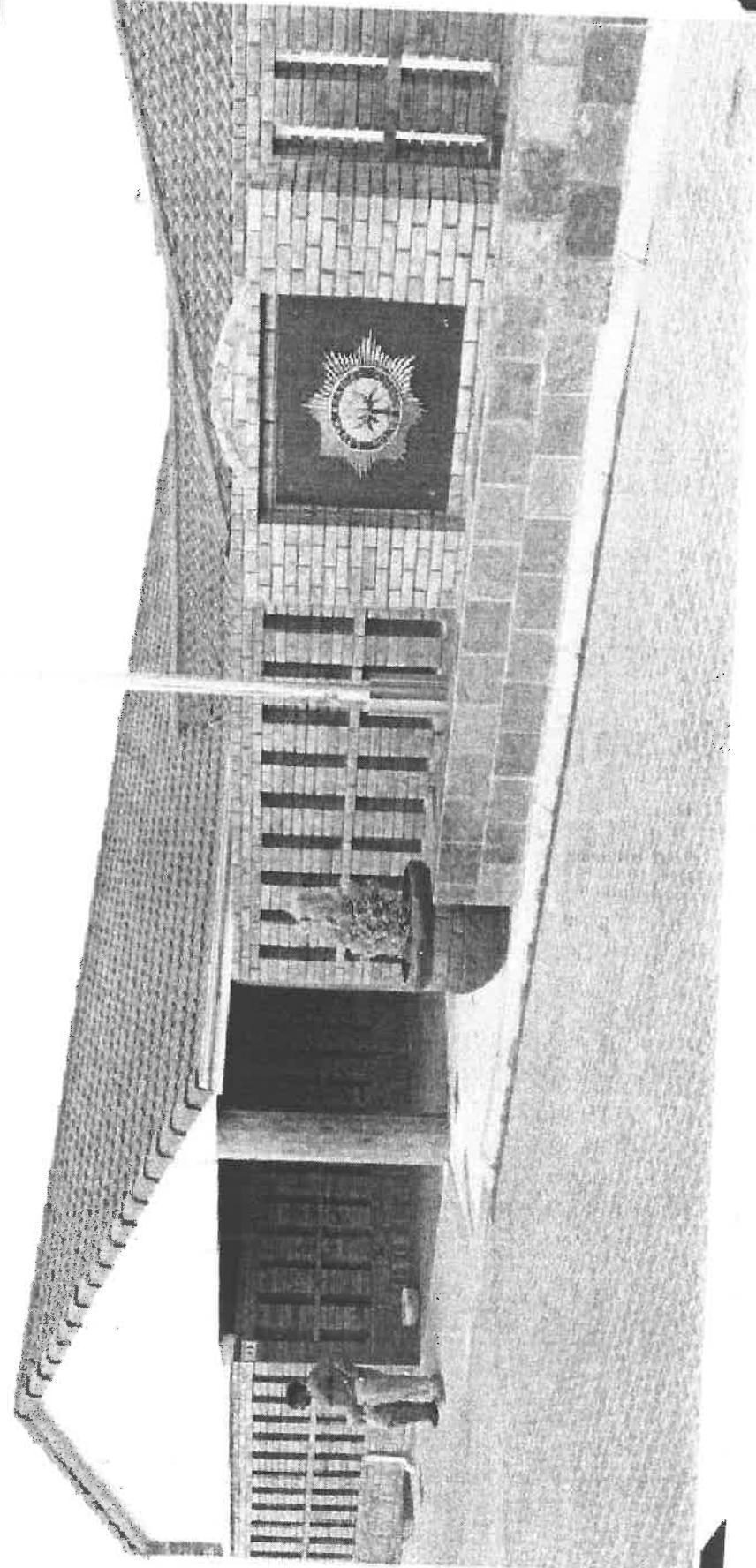

PROLOGUE BY THE STATION COMMANDER

In view of the crime being experienced by communities and with the high priority people are currently placing on safety and security, we the South African Police Service Harare in co-operation with the community, through the Community Police Forum and other community based organizations must commit ourselves to this plan and the roles to be played and must accept our responsibility to combat and prevent crime through policing actions, law enforcement and the follow through of the criminal justice system.

What we must realize is that situational and social crime prevention require commitment and an understanding of the complex dynamics that operate within society. It is also necessary to acknowledge that different types of crime have different causes and occur in different circumstances. It is thus essential to gain a better understanding of the nature and circumstances of the crime in order to begin to tackle it more effectively.

This plan must not be a shelf document and all role players must constantly execute their functions in line with the contents of this plan. Only then will we ensure an impact on our responsibility area's.

WESTERN CAPE POLICE SERVICE CHARTER

SAPS believe in the rights of all as enshrined in the Constitution and the Bill of Rights. SAPS will endeavour at all times, to provide a professional and efficient service and to always act in the spirit and the letter of the SAPS Code of Conduct. SAPS bind it to these minimum service standards

1. VICTIMS OF CRIME

SAPS will provide a quality and professional service, by keeping victims informed and to:

- Conduct interviews in a courteous manner with due regard for the dignity of the victim;
- Provide a crime reference number immediately and in any other case within 24 hours;
- Provide regular feedback on the progress of their cases, especially when a person has been arrested and when property has been identified;
- Provide timeouts information about court dates and any case at least 14 days before the court date;
- Provide a copy of their statements on request after consultation with the Director of Public Prosecutions;
- Provide specially trained officers for victims of sexual offences and child abuse and provide facilities for those victims where confidentiality is ensured;
- Inform about and provide witness protection where appropriate

2. CRIME

SAPS will ensure thorough and professional investigation of crime and;

- Provide specialist investigators where necessary (irrespective of the status of the individuals involved);
- Provide details of the Investigating Officer and information where to complain in the event of unsatisfactory service;
- Take the required steps to apprehend those responsible.

3. COMMUNICATION

- SAPS will answer all calls in a prompt and courteous manner and;
- Respond to emergency calls from the members of the public;
- Answer all 10111 calls within 15 seconds;
- Where this service is not available, publicise telephone numbers of local police stations;
- Attend public meetings and where appropriate, provide information on police services;
- Regularly elicit public opinion about police service standards

- SAPS believe that all suspects are presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law. We will:
 - Inform arrested persons of their Constitutional Rights;
 - Within reasonable time take them to the nearest police station for processing;
 - Not use illegal and unconstitutional means to obtain information.

COMMITMENT: The South African Police Services commits itself to recognise and build partnerships with the community and community police forums so as to combat crime effectively

We, as Police Officials of the South African Police Service commit ourselves to the creation of a safe and secure environment for all the people in South Africa by

utilize all the available resources responsibly, efficiently and cost effectively to maximize their use;

develop our own skills and participate in the development of our fellow members to ensure equal opportunities for all;

contribute to the reconstruction and development of, and reconciliation in our country;

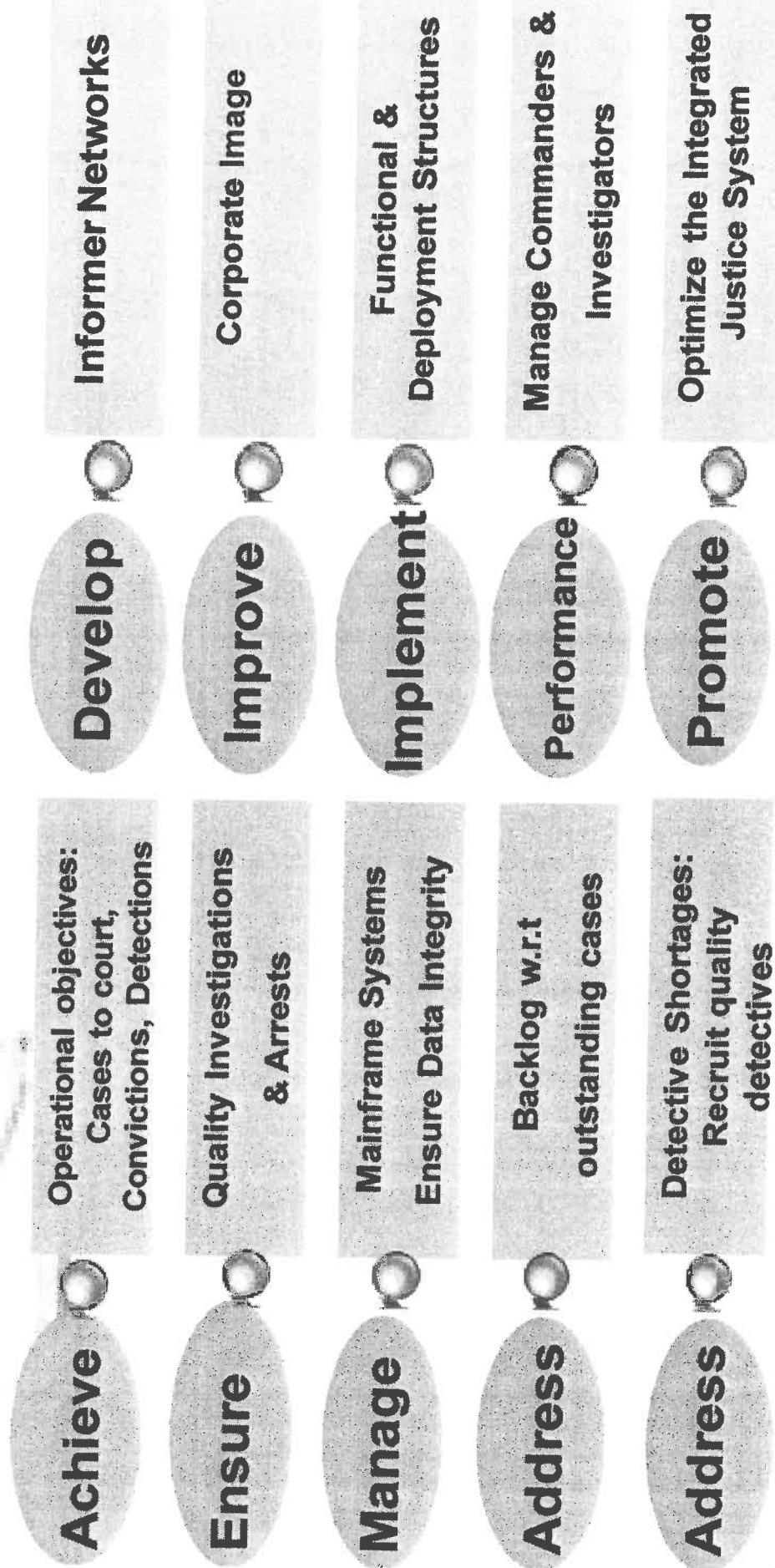
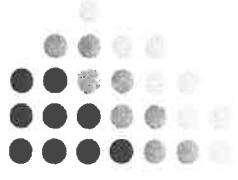
uphold and protect the fundamental rights of every person;

act impartially, courteously, honestly, respectfully, transparently and in an accountable manner;

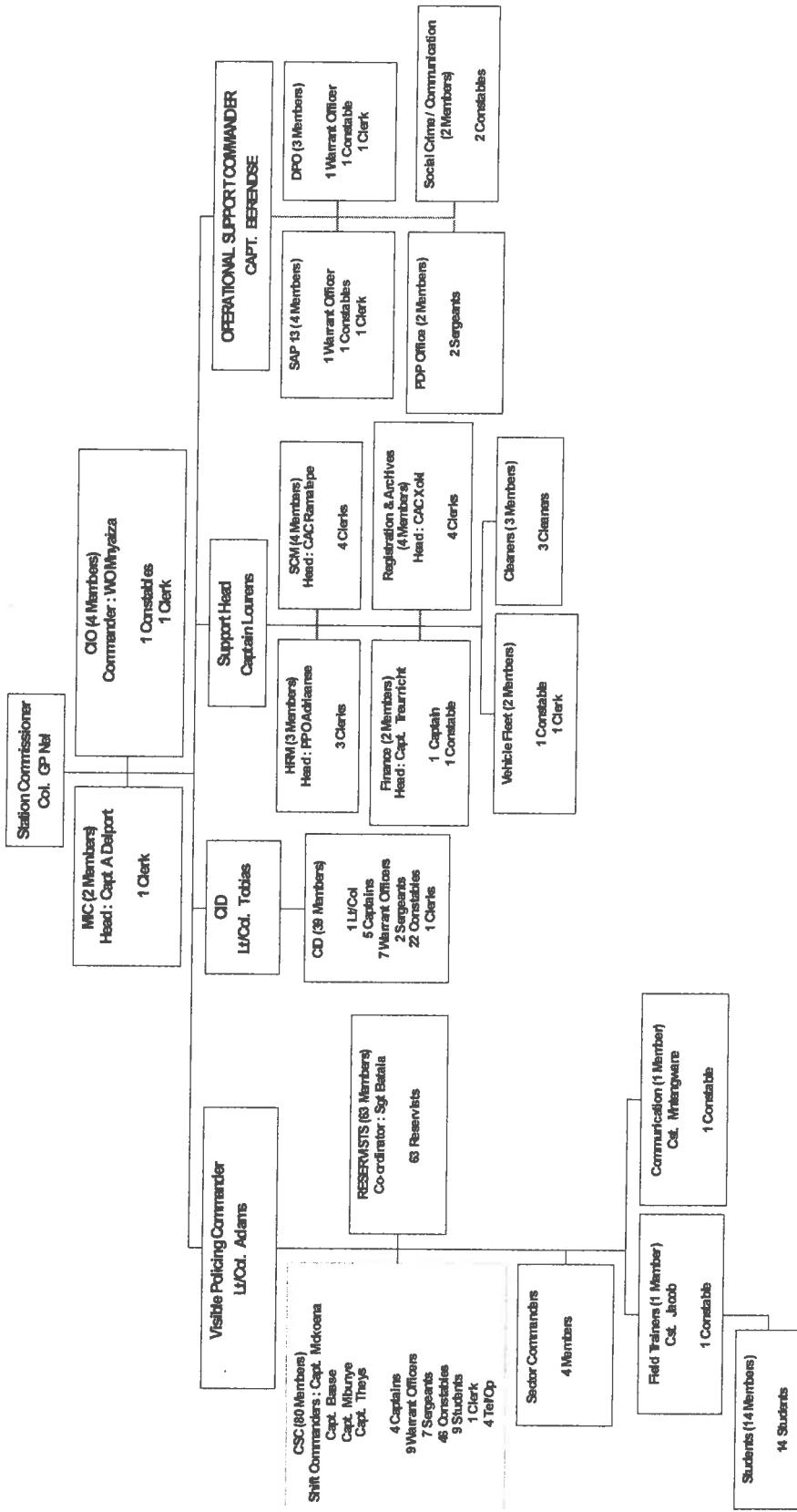
exercise the powers conferred upon us in a responsible and controlled manner; and
