A Bill to Amend the Soldiers (Exemption from Civil Process) Ordinance, 1940

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title and commencement.
No. 28 of 1940.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Soldiers (Exemption from Civil Process) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1944, and shall be read as one with the Soldiers (Exemption from Civil Process) Ordinance, 1940, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance, and shall come into operation on such date as the Governor may, by notice in the Gazette, appoint.

Amendment of section 3 of the principal Ordinance.

2. Section 3 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting sub-section (2) thereof and substituting the following therefor:—

“(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in any other law for the time being in force, no part of the pay of an officer or soldier serving in a scheduled unit shall be attached by direction of a court in satisfaction of any decree or order enforceable against him.”

Amendment of section 5 of the principal Ordinance.

3. Section 5 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by substituting a full stop for the comma immediately after the word “applies” in the third line thereof, and by deleting the words appearing thereafter to the end of the section.

Amendment of section 6 of the principal Ordinance.

4. Section 6 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting therefrom the comma and words “, in so far as the soldiers appointed to the King’s African Rifles Regiment on or after the 3rd day of September, 1939, are concerned,”.

OBJECTS AND REASONS

The pay of officers and soldiers of the United Kingdom forces is immune, by virtue of the Army Act, from attachment in satisfaction of civil debts. The object of this Bill is to accord the same immunity to officers and soldiers of the Colonial units set out in the Schedule to the principal Ordinance.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

A Bill to Amend the Juveniles Ordinance, 1934

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.
No. 22 of 1934.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Juveniles (Amendment) Ordinance, 1944, and shall be read as one with the Juveniles Ordinance, 1934, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance.

Amendment of section 16 of the principal Ordinance.

2. Section 16 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:—

- (a) by deleting the comma and the word “, whether” which appear in the sixth line of sub-section (1) thereof;
- (b) by deleting the word “or” which occurs at the end of paragraphs (a) to (k), inclusive, of sub-section (1) thereof; and
- (c) by inserting therein, immediately after sub-section (2) thereof, the following new sub-section:—

“(3) Nothing in this section contained shall be construed as in any way restricting the power of the court to pass any sentence or combination of sentences which it is empowered to pass under this or any other Ordinance for the time being in force;

Provided that no court shall order an offender to be whipped in addition to directing that he be sent to an approved school."

OBJECTS AND REASONS

Section 16 of the Juveniles Ordinance, 1934, has been the subject of much judicial interpretation in this Colony. The Supreme Court has held that, by reason of the word "or" appearing at the end of each of paragraphs (a) to (k) of section 16 (1) of the Ordinance, a court may only impose one of the forms of punishment there set out, and may not, for example, if a young person is convicted of assault causing actual bodily harm, sentence him to imprisonment *and* to corporal punishment, although section 245 of the Penal Code authorizes both those punishments for that offence.

The object of this Bill is, therefore, to place the matter beyond doubt.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

A Bill to Amend the Consolidated Edition of the Increase of Rent and of Mortgage Interest (Restrictions) Ordinance, 1940

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Increase of Rent and of Mortgage Interest (Restrictions) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1944, and shall be read as one with the Consolidated Edition of the Increase of Rent and of Mortgage Interest (Restrictions) Ordinance, 1940, prepared under the provisions of section 14 of the Increase of Rent and of Mortgage Interest (Restrictions) Ordinance, 1943, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance. Short title.
No. 12 of 1943.
- 2. Section 20 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows— Amendment of section 20 of the principal Ordinance.
 - 10 (a) by substituting a colon for the full stop at the end of sub-section (2) thereof and by adding thereto the following proviso:— No. 41 of 1943.

"Provided that nothing in this Ordinance contained shall apply to any approved dwelling which is the property of a local authority or to any dwelling-house which is the property of a Municipal Council or Municipal Board.";
 - 15 (b) by adding the following sub-section immediately after sub-section (2) thereof:— No. 19 of 1928.

"(3) For the purposes of this section the words 'approved dwelling' and 'local authority', shall have the same meaning as that assigned to them by the Housing Ordinance, 1943, and 'Municipal Council' and 'Municipal Board' mean a Municipal Council or Municipal Board established under the provisions of the Local Government (Municipalities) Ordinance, 1928."
 - 20

OBJECTS AND REASONS

The object of this Bill is to exempt from the provisions of the principal Ordinance all dwelling-houses which are the property of a Local Authority. There is constant need to review the conduct of the tenants of such dwelling-houses and their suitability for continued residence therein, most of which are let at less than an economic rent. It is considered that to continue to afford such tenants the protection of the principal Ordinance must jeopardize the successful operation of any municipal housing scheme.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

A Bill to Amend the King's African Rifles Ordinance, 1932

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

- Short title. 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the King's African Rifles (Amendment) Ordinance, 1944, and shall be read as one with the King's African Rifles Ordinance, 1932, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance, and shall not come into operation unless and until the Governor has declared by notice in the Gazette that it is His Majesty's pleasure not to disallow the same.
- No. 48 of 1932.
- Amendment of section 13 (1) of the principal Ordinance. 2. Sub-section (1) of section 13 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting therefrom the words "subject to this Ordinance" which occur in the second and third lines of paragraph (b) thereof and by substituting therefor the words "subject to military law".
- Amendment of section 15 of the principal Ordinance. 3. Section 15 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting therefrom the words "subject to this Ordinance" which occur in the third and in the sixth lines thereof and by substituting therefor in each case the words "subject to military law".
- Amendment of section 52A of the principal Ordinance. 4. Section 52A of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended—
(a) by deleting therefrom the words "of desertion or" which occur in the second line of sub-section (4) thereof; and
(b) by adding thereto the following sub-section immediately after sub-section (9) thereof:—
 “(10) Where an accused person is charged before a court martial with a civil offence and has been found guilty of any other offence as provided in sub-section (9) of this section the court shall not, when awarding punishment for such other offence, award any punishment greater than that provided for such an offence by the law of the Colony.”
- Insertion of new section 105A in the principal Ordinance. 5. The principal Ordinance is hereby amended by adding thereto, immediately after section 105 thereof, the following new section:—
 “105A. (1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any law in force in the Colony any member of the King's African Rifles may be transferred to any other military force lawfully established or serving in any East African territory:
 Provided that any member of the King's African Rifles so transferred shall for the purposes of pay, good conduct pay and gratuities on discharge retain his rights as a member of the King's African Rifles and his service in such other military force shall for the aforesaid purposes be taken into account to the same extent as if it were service in the King's African Rifles.
 (2) For the purposes of this section the term "East African territory" means the Colony, the Tanganyika Territory, the Uganda Protectorate, the Nyasaland Protectorate, the Zanzibar Protectorate, and the Somaliland Protectorate.”
- Transfer to other military forces.
- Minor amendments. 6. The sections of the principal Ordinance set out in the first column of the Schedule to this Ordinance shall have effect subject to the amendments respectively specified in the second column of the Schedule.
- Repeal. 7. Sections 9 and 10 of the King's African Rifles (Amendment) Ordinance, 1943, are hereby repealed.

- Section 47 By inserting immediately before the words "non-commissioned officer" in the first line of paragraph (1) and in the first line of paragraph (2) thereof, the words "warrant officer or".
- Section 48 (1) By inserting immediately before the words "non-commissioned officer" which occur in the sixth and seventh lines thereof, the words "warrant officer or".
- Section 49 By inserting immediately before the words "non-commissioned officer" in the first line of paragraphs (1) and (2) thereof the words "warrant officer or".
- Section 57 By inserting immediately before the words "non-commissioned officer" in the first line thereof, the words "warrant officer or", and by inserting immediately before the words "non-commissioned officer" in the marginal note thereof, the words "warrant officer and".
- Section 60 (2) By inserting immediately before the words "non-commissioned officer" which occur in the first and fourth lines thereof the words "warrant officer or".
- Section 105 (b) By inserting immediately before the words "non-commissioned officer" in the fifteenth line thereof, the words "warrant officer or".

OBJECTS AND REASONS

The object of Clauses 2, 3 and 4 of this Bill is to amend the principal Ordinance so as to bring it into line with the corresponding provisions of the Army Act.

Clause 5 re-enacts the provisions of sections 9 and 10 of the King's African Rifles (Amendment) Ordinance, 1943, and embodies them in the principal Ordinance. Such a course is considered desirable for the purposes of easier reference and convenience.

Clause 6 of the Bill seeks to apply certain provisions of the principal Ordinance respecting discipline, which apply to non-commissioned officers, to warrant officers.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of the Bill become law.

EXCLUSIVE ROAD SERVICE LICENCE
