#### 1. POLICE REPORT

PC Kelly Munro (badge number 923) and PC Angus Maclennan (badge number 100) attended the meeting and reported the following incidents:

- 1 x Assisting a member of the public
- 1 x Disorder 1 person arrested
- 2 x Domestic incidents 1 person arrested
- 1 x Road Traffic collision minor

During the month of July, the incidents reported to the police for the Tarbat Community Council beat area remained low.

Mr Reg Flegg is aware of the disorder incident.

The TCC has been contacted by a resident regarding the speed of traffic in the Main Street. Other concerns raised were parking along the Main Street making it difficult to drive down safely. Ideas discussed were speed bumps and 20 mph sign posting. Need to raise awareness to holiday visitors as they do not know the roads. Agreed to report to the Highland Council with a view to discussing ways of bring speeds limit down.

Congested car parking on the front street was discussed and wondered if the Pub could be asked to get their residents to park in the car park and not outside the pub as it causes traffic problems. It was also noted that the car park by the school was being used for work vans and motor homes.
