The win for the hard route was very closely contested with the top 3 being separated by just 3 marks! Oliver Wareing took best expert and the win by one mark from Glenn Lewis with Martin Bone coming in third and taking the best Intermediate Award. There was one section that was proving harder than all the others on the hard route where momentum across the slippery rocks was crucial, Martin Bone was best on this section dropping just 10 marks on it after 5 laps.

On the middle route John Holland on his trusty air cooled Yamaha had a great ride to finish on clean and take the best O/40 award he was closely followed by Kieran McDaid who dropped just 4 marks to take the best B n/c Award with Guy Bradley dropping 6 marks to take the Best A n/c Award, Alan Rushbrook took the best Novice Award dropping 13 marks.

The White route was won by Lee Coates who dropped just 4 marks to take the win from Mark Dixon who dropped 8 marks with Mervyn Carlton on his Twinshock Montesa coming in third with 9 marks lost.
