1st **Hymn** 14: The Lord's my Shepherd

1st Reading: Exodus Ch 24 v 12 - 18

The Lord said to Moses, "Come up to me on the mountain and stay here, and I will give you the tablets of stone with the law and commandments I have written for their instruction."

Then Moses set out with Joshua his aide, and Moses went up on the mountain of God. He said to the elders, "Wait here for us until we come back to you. Aaron and Hur are with you, and anyone involved in a dispute can go to them."

When Moses went up on the mountain, the cloud covered it, and the glory of the Lord settled on Mount Sinai. For six days the cloud covered the mountain, and on the seventh

day the Lord called to Moses from within the cloud. To the Israelites the glory of the Lord looked like a consuming fire on top of the mountain. Then Moses entered the cloud as he went on up the mountain. And he stayed on the mountain forty days and forty nights.

2nd Hymn 125: Lord of all being throned afar

2nd Reading: Matthew Ch 17 v 1 - 9

After six days Jesus took with him Peter, James and John the brother of James, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. There he was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and his clothes became as white as the light. Just then there appeared before them Moses and Elijah, talking with Jesus.

Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here. If you wish, I will put up three shelters—one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah."

While he was still speaking, a bright cloud covered them, and a voice from the cloud said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased. Listen to him!" When the disciples heard this, they fell facedown to the ground, terrified. But Jesus came and touched them. "Get up," he said. "Don't be afraid." When they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus.

As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus instructed them, "Don't tell anyone what you have seen, until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."

THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

The recognition of Jesus as the Christ at Caesarea Philippi and then his telling the disciples of how he must go to Jerusalem to face suffering and death is followed by the Transfiguration. It is as it, before all happened in Jerusalem, the disciples were given this glimpse of Jesus in his glory to give them hope in the future. Matthew continues to tell the story in a way that compares Jesus to Moses. The Transfiguration happened 'six days later'. In Exodus 24: 15-18 we hear of the cloud being on Mount Sinai for six days. The Lord came on Sinai in a cloud (Exodus 34: 29). All of these have parallels in the experience of the disciples on the mountain. Matthew draws this out: after telling us Jesus was transfigured and his face shone, he three times says, 'Behold'. This is seen best in the King James Bible, Matthew 17:3-5: ' behold there appeared unto them Moses and Elijah' (17: 3) behold, a bright cloud overshadowed them' (17:5) ' behold a voice out of the cloud which said, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased" (17:5). St Matthew wants us to see not only that the face of Jesus shone like that of Moses but also that Jesus fulfils the law given to Moses and the prophecies as exemplified by Elijah. The bright cloud is a symbol of the hidden presence of God. Even in the darkest days God is present. The cloud is a bright one to remind us of the presence. This can be compared to the pillar of cloud in the desert; the cloud that descended on the Tent of Meeting when the Lord came down on Sinai in a cloud.

The voice out of the cloud is the assurance of the presence, and the voice affirms again what was said at the Baptism of Jesus: that this is the Son and Beloved of God. As at the beginning of his ministry, so, as it comes near to a close, Jesus is affirmed by the Father. Jesus is the true icon, the true image of God. St John will write, 'The word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.'

Before this revelation the disciples bowed down in fear. Jesus came and touched them and said, 'Get up and do not be afraid.' Jesus ordered them, 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead.' Emphasising not only he is the Christ but the future resurrection.
