When Jesus heard that John had been put in prison, he withdrew to Galilee. Leaving Nazareth, he went and lived in Capernaum, which was by the lake in the area of Zebulun and Naphtali— to fulfil what was said through the prophet Isaiah:

"Land of Zebulun and land of Naphtali, the Way of the Sea, beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles—
The people living in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of the shadow of death a light has dawned."

From that time on Jesus began to preach, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near."

Jesus Calls His First Disciples

As Jesus was walking beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew. They were casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. "Come, follow me," Jesus said, "and I will send you out to fish for people." At once they left their nets and followed him.

Going on from there, he saw two other brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John. They were in a boat with their father Zebedee, preparing their nets. Jesus called them, and immediately they left the boat and their father and followed him.

Jesus Heals the Sick

Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and healing every disease and sickness among the people.

THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

We continue with Jesus being revealed as the Christ. Perhaps the arrest and imprisonment of John acted as a catalyst in making Jesus take up his ministry. Jesus leaves Nazareth. He leaves his home and goes to live in Capernaum. His life of ministry and his work of salvation now truly begins. This area of Galilee is the most northerly district of Palestine. It was not a large area, only 50 miles north to south and 25 miles east to west. But because it was the most fertile area of Palestine. It was densely populated.

Josephus records that there were 204 communities with populations of over 15,000 people. Jesus began his mission where there were the most people likely to hear him. Surrounded by Gentile nations, it was an area open to new ideas and used to change. This would be an area open to teaching and ministry of Jesus.

Matthew tells us that Jesus began to 'proclaim': the word he uses is that of a herald's proclamation. The herald speaks with a certainty of his message. Preachers cannot tell us anything with certainty if they have doubts themselves. The herald speaks with authority because he speaks on behalf of the king, from a source beyond himself. In this case, Jesus speaks the word of God. True preaching is concerning the word of God and not our own opinions or ideas.

The message is: Repent, turn around, turn to God. If we are not looking the right way, you cannot go the right way, Seek God. If we but know it, God's kingdom is near – it is because we look in the wrong direction that we that we do not see it or enter it.

Jesus now calls his first disciples. It is worth noting in Matthew that the initiative comes from Jesus. This is so often true: God/Jesus calls but so often we stall. He calls Simon Peter and Andrew as they are casting a net into the Sea of Galilee, saying, 'Follow me.' Immediately they leave their nets and follow him. They do not say, 'Wait until we have finished' or 'Wait until we have sold this fish'; they leave all and follow him. If we do not respond to the call immediately, we are less likely to respond later - though Jesus calls and calls.

In the same way he calls James and John who are in a boat with their father mending their nets. Immediately they leave the boat and their father and follow him. The two sets of brothers give up their security and their homes to follow the Master.

So the ministry of Jesus begins. Jesus travels through-out Galilee, teaching in Synagogues, proclaiming the Good News and healing people.
