FLOWER POWER POT

I have decorated this flower pot with DecoArt Patio Paint. It is weather resistant, scuff resistant and permanent. It dries to the touch on bisque in approx 10 minutes and is also self sealing.

Please use brushes of your choice. Where I think a particular brush works well I have mentioned it.



1 Center your flower pot on a banding wheel.



2 Using a 3/4" Square band two coats of Azalea to the flower pot avoiding the rim. Allow drying between coats.



3 Load a 1/2" square brush with Blue Bahama and band two coats to the rim. Allow drying between coats.

A nice project for Children or adults alike.



4 Using the flat side or the brush apply blue Bahama to the top edge of the flower pot.



5 Band a third coat of Azalea to the flower pot base and allow to dry.



6 Mix a little water with some Cloud White and band 3 coats to the inside of the flower pot with a mop brush. Allow drying between coats. Note: this is important to make it weather proof.



7 Apply 3 coats of Azalea to the base of your pot. Once dry, draw lightly your design on with pencil.



8 Apply 3 coats of Petunia Purple to your petals and allow to dry.



9 Apply 2 coats of Sunshine Yellow to the center of your flower.

4 Apply 3 coats of Bright Lime Green to your flowers stalk and leaves. Allow to dry.



5 Outline your flower and paint Flower Power on the rim with Wrought Iron Black.



6 Add Sunshine Yellow dots to the center of your flower using the lead end of a pencil.



7 To finish mix some Snow white with your Bahama Blue to lighten it. Using the end of a 3/4" mop brush dip into your mix and add dots to the rim.
