During the discussions throughout the day the following points were raised by Parent Council Representatives:

- More support from Highland Council to help Parent Councils communicate with one another and the parent forum:
 - They would like a mechanism for getting in touch with other Parent Councils.
 - They would like to be able to share email addresses more easily with each other, especially within in ASGs.
 - Guidance on how best they can engage with parents
 - They would like to have a forum where they can discuss issues, share good practice and easily gain access to information from the authority.
- Developing the relationship between the authority and Parent Councils:
 - They would like the Highland Council to engage and consult with them more frequently and more often.
 - They would like the opportunity to meet with Senior Management and be given notice on any plans which the council are considering i.e. cuts, provision of teaching.
 - They would like to set up a sub group which will have the opportunity to influence decisions.
 - A parent council representative sitting on the Children and Adult Services committee was discussed. Jim explained that this might not be the correct forum as at this stage it is more difficult to influence any decisions.

- Future events were discussed and the following points raised:
 - It would be beneficial for the conference to run twice a year rather than once.
 - Workshops should be split into two; one for new chairs where they can get some support and guidance and a second for more experienced chairs.
 - More input into agenda items, a survey being sent out prior to an event was suggested.
- Those who attended provided their email addresses and are happy for these to be shared with those could not attend the conference.
- Representatives requested that the information gathered from the workshops and the PowerPoint be circulated around all parent council members including those who were unable to attend.
