Background

- 1.1 Outline planning permission with all matters reserved other than access is sought for around 1,400m² of retail, use class A2, A3, A5 and betting office development on a 0.97 hectare area of land outside of but immediately adjacent to Prudhoe town centre.
- 1.2 The site has previously had the benefit of planning permission for residential, office and retail development as part of a larger town centre redevelopment scheme (ref: T/20070183). A current application for housing development is also proposed on land immediately adjacent to the north and has been submitted by the same applicant (ref: 16/02081/OUT).
- 1.3 The application was submitted as a valid application on the 29 June 2016.
- 1.4 This application is due to be determined by the Strategic Committee. As the application is of strategic interest and is on a site with a complex and controversial planning history it is considered beneficial for Members to familiarise themselves with the site and how it links to its neighbouring environment prior to their formal consideration of the planning application.

Site and Proposal

- 2.1 The application site is a steeply sloping greenfield site and has previously been used as allotment land but is currently disused and overgrown. It is adjoined by existing housing development with parking areas and commercial development to the south within the town centre.
- 2.2 Approval is only sought for access at this stage, although an indicative layout has been provided that shows how the development could be accommodated on the site. Vehicular access would be taken from Front Street via Tyne View Terrace to the south of the site.

3.2 Prudhoe Town Council has provided comments that support the application in principle as being good for the town. However, the Town Council has commented that it should be stipulated that this development should take place before that proposed in application ref: 16/02082/OUT (see separate report). One objection has been received from an adjacent resident at 15 Tyne View Terrace. This raises issues in respect of impacts from noise and light pollution, surface and foul water drainage, wildlife and land stability.

Background

- 1.1 Outline planning permission with all matters reserved other than access is sought on a 4.92 hectare site for a mixed use development of retail, drive -thru restaurant, restaurant, hotel and petrol station. The application sets out that the development could comprise:
 - Two foodstores comprising around 3,350 sgm (gross) floorspace in total;
 - Non-food retail floorspace comprising around 3,200 sqm (gross) floorspace in Use Class A1;
 - A 60-bed hotel:
 - Two restaurants (Use Class A3 and/or A4 and/or A5) of a round 485 sqm and 380 sqm (gross) floorspace respectively, one of which would have a drive-thru facility;
 - · A petrol station; and
 - 434 parking spaces.
- 1.2 The site is located out of town and is identified as employment land. The application has therefore been advertised as a departure from the development plan.
- 1.3 The application was submitted as a valid application on the 16 June 2016.
- 1.4 This application is due to be determined by the Strategic Committee. As the application is of strategic interest and raises policy issues in relation to its out of town location it is considered beneficial for Members to familiarise themselves with the site and how it links to its neighbouring environment prior to their formal consideration of the planning application.

Site and Proposal

- 2.1 The application site is located to the northern edge of Prudhoe on two parcels of land south of the bypass (A695 Princess Way) and Low Prudhoe Industrial Estate.
- 2.2 Approval is only sought for access at this stage, although an in dicative layout has been provided that shows how the development could be accommodated on the site. Vehicular access would be taken from the existing road infrastructure in the locality.

is subject to the Council ensuring a full flood risk assessment has been undertaken and SuDS solutions are put in place; that transport issues are properly addressed, including detail in the Travel Plan; and concerns raised by the County Ecologist are addressed. No objections have been received from residents, businesses or other interested parties.

Background

- Outline planning permission with all matters reserved other than access is sought for the construction of up to 30 dwellings on a 0.98 hectare area of land close to Prudhoe town centre. The site is adjoined to the north by an area of land that has the benefit of an outline permission for 70-80 dwellings granted in January 2015 (ref: 13/03076/OUT). The site has also previously had the benefit of planning permission for residential, office and retail development as part of a larger town centre redevelopment scheme (ref: T/20070183). A current application for retail and commercial development is also proposed on land immediately adjacent to the south and has been submitted by the same applicant (ref: 16/02083/OUT).
- 1.2 The application was submitted as a valid application on the 29 June 2016.
- 1.3 This application is due to be determined by the Strategic Committee. As the application is of strategic interest and is on a site with a complex and controversial planning history it is considered beneficial for Members to familiarise themselves with the site and how it links to its neighbouring environment prior to their formal consideration of the planning application.

Site and Proposal

- 2.1 The application site is a steeply sloping greenfield site and has previously been used as allotment land but is currently disused and overgrown. It is adjoined by existing housing development with parking areas and commercial development further to the south within the town centre.
- 2.2 Approval is only sought for access at this stage, although an indicative layout has been provided that shows how residential development could be accommodated on the site. Vehicular access would be taken from Station Road to the west at the same point that access has been approved for the approved residential development to the north of the application site. It is proposed to provide 15% affordable provision on the site.
