Apologies for the slight delay in getting back to you. It's great to hear that there is interest in running a community event.

What would be the best way of discussing this in greater detail and making some arrangements? I would be happy to come up to Prudhoe at some point to discuss or we can establish something via email?

In order to lay out some background, when I have run events like this in the past they have been done in one of two ways:

1. Standalone workshops with 5-10 people at a time. These take 1-2 hours each but do work very well if people have a lot of information and want to go into detail.
2. Drop-in sessions where people come and go as required. I've previously run these alongside Council/EA events and have very good input.

I am happy to run either or both of these formats if you thought there was demand and/or if there is a suitable event that I might piggy-back onto.
