Report for Annual Parish Meeting.

Creaton Walking Group has been in existence for over 10 years and once again this year has enjoyed monthly walks in our native Northamptonshire, over the border in Leicestershire and also major walks further afield. We have been delighted to welcome new walkers both from surrounding villages and further afield to share the company of this friendly group. Average number of walkers is 10 plus one or two dogs. The walkers are grateful to their strong supporters group who provide a rescue service and join the group for lunch.

During the year, in addition to the local walks, some of the group completed the 290 mile Macmillan Way from Boston in Lincolnshire to Abbotsbury in Dorset which goes up Creaton High Street! A stunning walk through varying terrain, with Creaton certainly being amongst the prettiest places visited. Note the new signpost on the High Street! Some of the walkers also did the 90 mile Dales Highway which included 2 of the Yorkshire peaks. The next long-distance challenge is from Creaton to Canterbury.

The group also did their traditional New Year's Day walk to clear the cobwebs!

Walks are on the second Saturday of the month and the group meet at the lychgate at 10am. Routes are usually a 3 hour circular walk ending with an optional lunch in a local pub. New walkers are always welcome and are advised to wear walking boots and to bring water with them.
