SOCIETY RULES

The entry fee for all classes is **50p**, with a maximum of **£2 for Under16's and £5 for Adults**

All exhibits, except floral art, must be the property of the exhibitor

Exhibitors are limited to **one** entry per class

Exhibits will be accepted on day of show between **9.30am and noon**. Each entry to have a society label **attached**. These available from secretary or at the door on day of show

No one to be admitted to show, except judges and stewards during judging. Show opens at **3pm**

No exhibits to be removed until after presentation of trophies.
Photographs will be taken of all Prize winners.

Entrants for the garden competitions are permitted to employ labour prior to **15th. May**, and have assistance with grass cutting at any time

Any exhibitor found in conversation with judges prior to completion of judging will be disqualified

The judges' decision is final, no complaints will be entertained

Although all reasonable care will be taken, the committee will not be answerable for any damage

All Glen residents from Corrimony to Brackla, Lennie to Bunloit, and **all children on school roles**, are eligible to compete.

TATTIE SPECIAL

HANDY HINTS FOR EXHIBITORS

1. Make sure your entry fits the description in the Schedule.
2. Follow the Schedule carefully.
3. Make sure in flower arrangements you comply with sizes in schedule.
4. Display all produce with stalks intact.
5. Uniformity between items is important in both shape and size whether it applies to vegetables, fruit or cakes.
6. Fruit should not be polished.
7. Cakes look better displayed on a doily on a white paper plate.
8. Bread is usually displayed on a bread board.
9. Lemon Curd should have been made within 3 weeks of the Show and should state date made on label.
10. External appearance as well as flavour is also important in cookery.
11. Pot plants must have been in owners care for at least 2 months prior to show.

FROM PRE-SCHOOL TO HIGH SCHOOL

Grow 1 tattie in a bag/pot/bucket

Approximately 25/30 cm diameter.

Bring your container to the show on Saturday morning.

Your container will be emptied and the crop weighed.

£10 for the heaviest crop of tatties.
