Chord symbols for the first system:

- Measure 1: D
- Measure 2: Em D/F# G
- Measure 3: D Bm Em/G A7
- Measure 4: D Em D/F# G

Chord symbols for the second system:

- Measure 5: D A7 G D
- Measure 6: D D/F# G G/B
- Measure 7: D Bm Em/G A7

Chord symbols for the third system:

- Measure 8: D D/F# G G/B
- Measure 9: D A7 Em/G D
- Measure 10: D D/F# G D/F#

Chord symbols for the fourth system:

- Measure 11: G D/F# G A7
- Measure 12: D Em D/F# G
- Measure 13: D A7 G D
