During 2016 Connecting Young Carers has seen an increased number of young people who have either taken on a caring or support role for a sibling with additional support needs or are significantly impacted by a sibling's health or complex disability.

Sibling Young Carers are often overlooked when the term Young Carer is mentioned,

however many families say how supportive, helpful and patient their children are with a brother or sister who requires additional care or attention.

To alleviate the pressures on Young Carers Connecting Young Carers provide opportunities for Young Carers to have a break from caring, an opportunity to do something fun with other young people who have similar caring experiences. Throughout the year



Connecting Young Carers A better life for unpaid carers in Highland

Connecting Young Carers run a variety of days out and events and are keen to encourage more young people to come along.

In recognising the importance of time out or quality family time for Sibling Carers Connecting Young Carers are excited to announce the introduction of a new fund for Sibling Carers. Young people aged 11+ are eligible to apply for up to £150 towards the cost of a break or activity that allows them to have a treat.

With an estimated **31,000 unpaid carers in Highland**, the total number of carers in the area has risen by 10% in 10 years and that figure is expected to keep on rising. Carers can be as young as five years old and is it acknowledged that one in 12 secondary schools pupils has a caring role.

Caring can happen at any time, to any one and every day in the UK 6,000 people become carers. For some it's sudden and unexpected; someone is taken ill or has an accident, a child is born with a disability. For others caring creeps up unnoticed; parents who can't manage any more on their own or a partner whose health gradually gets worse.
