Words Up has been developed in Highland and is now being used universally to help with supporting children to develop their language and communication skills. It is usually introduced through some training and sharing of posters for

the settings the children are in. It uses basic key messages to remind us all what we should be trying to do to help ALL children develop their language and communication, depending on what developmental stage they are at. When it looks at the child's individual stage, Words UP suggests 4 stages that a child could be at and what those around the child should try doing to help them develop on to the next stage in their development. For example when at the "using first words" stage;

Pause & Wait - This gives the child a chance to take a turn in the interaction and gives them time to figure out what to say/try saying.

Copy and Add words – Copy what they say and add one word, keeping it at their level.

## **Book Recommendation on ADHD**

A parent recently borrowed a book from the CHIP library to help her child understand his newly diagnosed condition as the Mum wasn't sure how to explain things. The book is called "Zak has ADHD" by Jenny Leigh and after reading it to her child, she said it really helped him to understand why he feels like he does and that there is help for him to manage day to day pressures better. It also helped his siblings understand what their brother was feeling and why he sometimes acted as he did. Available to borrow free of charge for a month from the CHIP library.

Tracey Francis travelled to Norway, Italy & the Czech Republic to explore transition & post-school experiences of young people with ADHD, Tourette's and autism to assess the inclusion & integration of people with learning difficulties in mainstream education, employment & community life. These three countries have a history of strong legislative commitments to inclusion, so to assess how this translated into support, Tracey was funded through the Winston Churchill Memorial Trust to report on her findings, blogging and finalising with reports which are all available to read on the website.
