

TRANSITIONS COORDINATOR SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS

Inverness College UHI has a dedicated transitions coordinator who will act as a link between students and Personal Academic Tutors, Guidance, Learning Support and Student Finance. Students who may need this service are, for example, those who have anxiety issues, those with caring responsibilities or maybe just need a bit more support moving to Further or Higher education.

Transition coordinator, Barbara Isaacs, helps students settle in to college life quicker and ease the transition period as much as possible. She will provide information and general guidance to ensure students are prepared for their course and making the most of student life.

Barbara will have informal meetings with students to get to know them and support them throughout their time at Inverness College UHI where necessary. How to Recognise a Young Carer

With an estimated 1 in 12 secondary school pupils having a caring role of some kind it means that there might be two or three in your class. On average in Highland Young Carers spend three hours a day caring for someone. That's three hours of not watching TV, not Snapchatting, not hanging out with their friends. Three hours of caring, not doing coursework or revising.

On the plus side 63% of Young Carers say that in caring for someone it helps them feel closer to the person they care for and many of them feel that they are coping well.

Young Carers...

- Might be very private about their home lives
- Might sometimes be late for school or find it hard to concentrate
- Not invite friends to their homes for a chill out
- Sometimes have difficulty keeping plans with friends
- Feel bad about letting friends down
- Find it hard to switch off from their caring role
- Worry that others might not understand their caring role and judge them for it

Its ok for families to talk about caring and its impact on them all. Talking to others can help relieve the stress of caring and sharing experiences with other Young Carers is really helpful. Talking to

guidance staff or a favourite teacher can also help. It's a way of getting more information about

organisations like Connecting Young Carers but also a good way for schools to know about a caring situation and how best to support you.

Young Carers we know have told us how important it is that their close friends understand their situation and many have said that "*they wish they'd told their friends sooner*".

So far Culloden, Kingussie, Inverness Royal Academy and Alness have all learned about Young Carers, the challenges they face and the opportunities available.

Gemma's presentations are made more real with the inclusion of videos showing what life is really like for Young Carers in Highland. The videos, made by Young Carers themselves, are part of a project with our Young Carer Youth Ambassadors.
