Adult Diagnosis Group

A 10 week programme for people who have had a diagnosis of an Autistic Spectrum Condition in their teens or as adults and would like to know more about the condition.

A 10 week programme to help people deal with anxiety and/or low mood;

• Employment Group

Groups sessions for anyone who is interested in paid employment. Each group session would focus on a different aspect of employment.
