Offer children and young people a calm and safe space to be able to undertake a range of art and play activities. The sessions are tailored to meet individual children's interest and needs. The ethos of these creative sessions is not about artistic skill, but about empowering children/ young people to express themselves in a creative medium that feels comfortable for them and at a pace that suits them. The outcomes for these sessions are to encourage choice, independence, reduce isolation and build selfesteem whilst also having fun and relaxina. These sessions are suitable for children with a range of

additional support needs. Session times can range from 1.5 hours to 3 hours and can take place as a one to one session or as a sibling/family group. Please note these sessions are

Right Start Project

Bobath Scotland has received Big Lottery funding to deliver the Right Start project for young children with cerebral palsy between the ages of 2-6 years old. The project will support children and their families in preparing them for the transition into school life.

Right Start's objectives are twofold, focussing on the child and the family around the child. As part of the project they are able to offer Bobath therapy sessions to families of children between the ages of 2 – 6years old, open to any family.

You would need to pay for your own travel and attend one hour sessions two to three times per week across four intermittent weeks between October 2016 and June 2017 [Inverness location TBC]. Carers discount in Raigmore canteen

Unpaid carers can now access catering discount of 50% in staff canteens within Raigmore Hospital. This system has been in operation in the Children's Ward for a number of years and now recognises the valuable contribution that unpaid carers make during their visits to the Hospital.
