#### Marion's Shop & Filling Station

This is the only shop on the island.

Licensed to sell petrol and alcohol, the Shop retails dry as well as other wet fuels.

The Shop also retails fresh and frozen products, canned and dried foods. And canned and dried foods for cats and dogs.

All products are sourced locally from accredited suppliers (i.e. those registered with the OIC Environmental Health Department).

Comestibles from kitchen table amateurs are never offered for sale. And, although the sale of teas, postcards and ice-creams is contentious when neighbours can be beffared [sic] a policy of avoidance is preferable.

However, local craft items will be re-introduced. A Handling Charge of no more than 10% will be requested. Teas, et cetera, will not be offered.

#### **Letter from School Place**

It has been a miserable start to the year, with some extreme weather conditions which are predicted to become commonplace conditions in the lifuture. Members of my own family had some adventures getting back to Orkney from Scotland, what with cancelled ferries and flooded railway lines. Eday's pier was seriously damaged by sea surges, and Sanday's water was threatened by stormy conditions stirring up the silt in Bea Loch necessitating tankers of water being sent out by Scottish Water to supplement supplies. And, of course, there have been power cuts, damage to property, influenza.... It is the custom in Switzerland for each household to store ample stocks of food, fuel etc. for an emergency. A commonsense New Year's Resolution for us islanders to keep, I think.

Our last formal meeting of 2015 was a Special General meeting on our response to the Scottish Government's consultation on provisions for a future islands bill. The aim of the consultation was to seek views on plans for giving more power and protection to Scotland's islands, the intention being that these will help shape the development of a Scottish Parliament bill allowing the islands to build a more prosperous and fairer future for their communities. A draft of our response can be found on the OIC website.

We have had several budget briefings to try and thrash out how we are going to manage the £5,000,000 cut to our funding by the Scottish Government. Moray Council has considered raising its council tax by 18%. The trouble with this solution is that the Scottish Government will now impose a penalty on them for breaking its "council tax freeze", which means their council tax is having to be raised by more than would otherwise be necessary. In the case of Orkney, a 10% increase in council tax would collect approx. £751,000 extra from taxpayers, but the Scottish Government would then take away £243,000 in penalty from us, leaving us with only £508,000 extra for the budget. Any increase up to 3.3% would bring in no extra money to the Council, even though it would increase the financial burden on our council tax payers. OIC is still working with the Convention of Scottish Local Authorities (COSLA) to encourage the Scottish Government to give us a better settlement.

I participated in a Scottish Transport Appraisal Guidance (STAG) development options workshop at Scapa with consultants Peter Brett Associates. Their work will consider the internal air and ferry network and associated infrastructure and the needs of the communities moving forward. I particularly stressed the point that the "needs" absolutely have to include the need for economic growth and increase in island populations; otherwise our future transport system could lock us into the status quo. As part of the consultation process, the consultants will be engaging initially with island transport reps followed by community consultation in May.

Other meetings I have attended this month include: my monthly "catch-up" with the Executive Director of Education, Leisure & Housing, an Empowering Communities Working Group meeting (with very positive reports back from the pilot islands of Stronsay and Papa Westray), a community council meeting on Papa Westray, a meeting of Sanday's parent council, and licensing meetings.

Speaking of licensing, do you remember our decision to reject an application for a bookmakers in Kirkwall containing fixed-odds betting terminals (Letter from School Place March 2014 & May 2015)? Well, MSPs on Holyrood's Local Government & Regeneration Committee have now called for a ban on such gaming machines. Their inquiry found "local authorities felt powerless to stop the spread of fixed-odd betting terminals". Not Orkney!

I wish to congratulate Mrs Rosemary Newton, who has returned to Sanday from Buckingham Palace with an MBE medal (which she kindly showed me) "for services to outdoor education and to the community in Orkney". It is great when members of our communities receive such recognition for all they have contributed. In fact, anyone can nominate somebody to be considered for such an award, and details on how to do it can be found on the UK Government webpages. #### **DSM**

Installation has begun into the six shortlisted trial households and we await the final connections of these households to the controllers at the 900kW turbine. This work is helping us prepare our application to the Local Energy Challenge Fund which is due for submission on 12 February.

The construction phase of this project is currently ongoing, and the Trust requests that everyone keep away from the site during this phase, and remain away until the Trust is sure it is safe to enter. We will let you all know when all the work is complete, and the park is safe to use. Thank you.
