Now that Highland Broadband have substantially completed installation of their network we intend to carry out resurfacing works at a number of locations within Dornoch and Embo.

These works form part of the Highland Council's Capital Structural Programme for 2023 / 24 and require to be completed by 1st April.

Weather permitting works will commence next Monday 4th March with a planing operation to remove the existing failed road surfaces, this should take 3 to 4 days.

This will be followed this with a surfacing operation to lay a new road surface.

All works will be carried out by Highland Council staff.

Thanks Lynn and Darren

I understand your concerns and frustration with the prolonged period that the ground has been saturated. It is difficult to know how much of this can be attributed to the slow flow of the burn and how much to the exceptionally wet winter that we have had, particularly with reference to the parts of the caravan park away from the burn that have standing water every winter. Digging a new channel may help, but equally it may not resolve all the groundwater issues in the caravan park.

The political direction is that we should seek a short term fix (i.e. dig a channel) followed by a long term solution (design and implement a sustainable solution for water management in lower Dornoch burn, using the RRC report a starting point). We are working on this, but we operate within a framework of regulations that have to be adhered to.

We met with a SEPA officer last Friday who has confirmed that SEPA does not need to be involved with digging of a new channel (approx 50m in length) through the last sand bank/ dune on to the beach.

We now need to follow up other issues including:

- whether a Marine Scotland licence would be required to dig a channel
- need to consider any coastal protection issues/ implications of digging new channel
- any liability issues for the organisation (Council) that commissions any work, and whether it is possible for third parties (Caravan Park, Golf Club) to indemnify the Council against any damage resulting from that work, and whether those third parties would be willing to do so.

I have a meeting tomorrow (Thurs) to discuss these issues with HC flood team and NatureScot.

Additionally, before any work can be carried out, we would also need to

- Agree on location and job spec.
- Identify contractor.

Given this, we need to be realistic about timescales.

Finally, I have attached the report from recent coastal flooding at Golspie. I do not think you will have seen this, but it gives some context of the problems happening along the coast and what can happen during a storm surge. In particular, please see the sections relating to Golspie Caravan park and Kart Track.

Hi

We are opening in 1 week s time. It is obvious that the overflow from the burn is not going anywhere until we help it find its way out to the shore. As a result, the water table is very high all over the carvan park. We have about 8 static caravans which are inaccessible at the present time. We will probably have to give the owners money off their site fees if they cannot access there caravans at easter. We also have about 25 pitches which are currently under water. Again, they will not be usable until we help the stagnant water reach the sea!! We currently have 55 booked in for easter Saturday. We are going to have to limit this number to 60. My suspicion is that we probably would have reached capacity of 80 for easter weekend but cannot take this number because of the stagnant water around the burn.

We are begging you to hurry the process up for releasing the stagnant water as it is costing us lots of money and lots of very hard conversations with our regular customers. It is an easy process which could be done tomorrow if permission was granted. Why on earth is this dragging on so long! If it is money which is the issue....we have already stated that we will be happy to help as it will save us money in the long term

I know this is a rant but what else can I do....you would probably fine me or jail me if I went and did the work myself!!!


