JB provided further clarification on the matter. After discussion, the application to the Dornoch Common Good was unanimously recommended for acceptance. In addition, the work of Sir Gavin Gilbey in this initiative was highly commended, with PM, DM and GS also receiving commendation for the part they have played.	PM,JB
