DACC POLICY ON RESPONSES TO PLANNING APPLICATIONS

- 1. As part of the statutory planning process, DACC has the right to object/comment/express support on any application.
- 2. When considering an application any of four decisions are possible:
 - a. Object,
 - b. Support,
 - c. Comment, and
 - d. No Comment.
- 3. DACC's default position will be 'No Comment' unless:
 - a. A significant majority of members present vote to Support or Object
 - b. A simple majority of members present vote to **Comment**
- 4. Normally DACC will not intervene in applications for single residential homes. Exceptions to this could be applications which affect a significant part of the Dornoch Area Community (e.g due to adverse effect on a public footpath, a widely visible area of natural beauty or the conservation area of Dornoch).
- 5. Official responses are made following an invitation to Consult from the planning authority. Such invitations <u>may</u> be sent out as a matter of course by the authority if deemed appropriate, but if not then a specific request for Consultation should be submitted to the named planning officer.
- 6. Once a Consultation has been received, DACC should submit its agreed decision in writing to the named planning officer in a clear and well-reasoned manner. In particular if DACC objects, the word 'Object' must be clear and not able to be misinterpreted as a mere comment.
