

Oct 6th 1946.

The monthly committee meeting was held at Blunckfield on Oct 6th. Mrs Drew presiding; apologies were sent by Mrs Butcher and Mrs Lane.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and signed. During four the minutes, a letter was read from Miss Chamberlain, saying we would need £100 more to pay gifts to the men still serving. Teas to be provided and members to canvass their own districts - a letter was also read from the Director of Education stating it was impossible to provide a bus to bring children to school from Roke, so, it was decided a letter be sent to Bullingdon Rural Council, asking that the footpath from Benson to Roke marsh be repaired immediately.

The monthly letter was read.

Mrs Aldridge said that the meeting of the Dramatic Society was not very successful & another meeting was to be held, when it was hoped more would be present and a start made. Mrs B. Douglas said she would, like ^{as press correspondent}, to accept the invitation from the Editor of the Oxford Times to be shown round Newspaper House Oxford.
