

Use selective thinning to open up external views, particularly from knoll.

Continue to foster relationships with Farr School, other community groups and Highland Council.

Use Low Impact Silvicultural Systems (LISS) (thinning) to develop seed crowns and promote conditions to encourage natural regeneration









Maintain wetland areas by removing natural regeneration and keeping drains blocked.
