Midlothian Council's Community Planning Partnership (CPP) asked each of Midlothian's sixteen Community Council areas to produce an action plan to bring together local residents with partner agencies to identify and find solutions to local issues.

Local volunteers along with members of Midlothian Council and other agencies established Rosewell Neighbourhood Group (RNG). The group chose to produce the plan for Rosewell area in a calendar format with an easy to read summary of the findings, thus creating a document that would be of use to every home in the community and providing a comprehensive resource to refer to throughout the year.

Over the 5 year period of the action plan calendars have been hand delivered to every home and business in the Rosewell district area by the members of RNG, with help from other community groups.

Due to the success of the calendar Rosewell & District Community Council (RDCC) have agreed to oversee the production of the calendar, which can only happen with the very kind support of local businesses and volunteers.

Rosewell Resilience Group

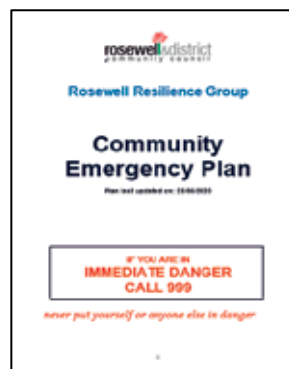
Rosewell Resilience Group was established in 2019 and affiliated with our Community Council.

Working with Midlothian's Resilience Contingency Planning Officer our group's first task was to produce Rosewell's community emergency plan which raises awareness and highlights potential risks to our community, also supporting and encouraging effective communication between our community and responders.

Emergency Plan risk assessment requires Volunteers to only carry out essential volunteering duties and if asked to check on vulnerable people will always be in pairs, carry identification and not enter their house.. Our group was the first in Midlothian until this crisis.

Our emergency plan contains:

- an overview of the risks to our community
- a list of key community resources, helpful for noting down key contacts and resources within the community that can be brought together in a response to an incident.
- a phone tree containing key contacts and provides a clear line of communication for alerting those within the community that are part of pre-arranged response arrangements.
- useful contacts and links of organisations we may require for advice before or after an incident has occurred.



Social Media

Rosewell Neighbourhood Group Facebook page was created in January 2018 and now has over 1200 members. The page is moderated by our Community Council and remains a community neighbourhood page to share local information. Advertising will remain limited to supporters of our projects, however members can share recommendations good or bad. Please join our page to keep up to date and share 'what's happening' in and around Rosewell. So far, we have helped find lost dogs, reunited lost property, responded to recommendations, highlighted road closures, power cuts, bins on fire, recognised and thanked local heroes for community gestures.

The Great Outdoors

The outdoors provides opportunities for open-air recreation and education with benefits for health and well-being. The **Scottish Outdoor Access Code** gives detailed guidance on responsibilities and a practical guide to help everyone make informed decisions about what is best to do in everyday situations.

The Scottish Outdoor Access Code has 3 principles

1. Respect the interests of other people
2. Care for the environment
3. Take responsibility for your own actions

Your access rights and responsibilities

Take responsibility for your own actions

Take care for your own safety, keep alert for hazards, take special care with children.

Respect people's privacy and peace of mind

Do not act in ways that might annoy or alarm people, especially at night.

Help land managers and others to work safely and effectively

Keep clear of land management operations like harvesting or tree felling, avoid damaging crops, leave gates as you find them.

Care for your environment

Do not disturb wildlife, take your litter away with you.

Keep your dog under proper control

Dogs are popular companions, but take special care if near livestock, or during the bird breeding season, and always pick up after your dog.

Take extra care if you are organising an event or running a business

Talk to the managers of any land which you may plan to use intensively or regularly.



The Benefits

Spending time enjoying the outdoors is very important for health and well-being.

Relaxing and taking exercise in the fresh air is good for physical and mental health.

Not only is it free to do, you can start on your doorstep by visiting local parks and woods.

There are a lot of lovely walks around Rosewell and the surrounding area.



Staying Healthy

Each year some people are affected by infections caught outdoors, which could be avoided by following some simple precautions.

Handwashing, as a number of germs are commonly carried by farm animals such as E.Coli and Cryptosporidium. These germs can be present anywhere in the outdoors and may cause illness if swallowed.

They are usually passed from your hands to your mouth, and hands don't need to look dirty to carry them. You can pick these germs up through touching, stroking or petting animals. Contact with fields, fences, gates and buildings where animals have been kept.

This is why it's really important to wash your hands thoroughly before eating or drinking.

Pregnant women should avoid contact with animals giving birth and newborn animals as they may carry germs that can be particularly risky in pregnancy.

The best way of protecting yourself is by washing your hands thoroughly with soap and water. This should be done before eating, drinking or doing anything else that brings your hands into contact with your mouth, such as smoking,

When out and about, and there is no running water, you could use baby wipes or hand sanitisers which are now readily available. They are not 100% effective against all germs so remember to wash your hands with soap and water at the earliest opportunity.

Remember to drink fresh water and you should carry your own refillable drinking bottle.

ROSEWELL PRIMARY SCHOOL – THE PLACE TO BE CONFIDENT, BE KIND, WORK HARD AND HAVE FUN !

Here at Rosewell Primary School we think our school is unique and we are very proud of our heritage. Our learners participated in a mining project and found out that Rosewell is a former mining village. The mine or pit as it was known was closed down in 1961. Inspired by the mining project, when we were asked to design a theme for The Oor Wullie Big Bucket Trail, there was no doubt that Oor Rose Wullie had to be a miner. The learners discovered that long ago children worked down the mines from a very early age. They wondered what Oor Rose Wullie would have made of this and how he would look dressed up for work. We were delighted to take part in a national campaign. That sums us up: we are a wee school that loves big adventures.



What do learners like most about Rosewell? Well we have lots of opportunities to learn in a fun and active way. We are lucky to have a wonderful playground to explore and an Outdoor Classroom on our doorstep. Through Rosewell Development Trust our P6 learners all have the opportunity to work towards The John Muir Award. One of our school values is Work Hard and we do – we have high expectations of all our learners and staff at Rosewell but we also like to have fun and be creative.

Here are some of the ways we have fun: Our school choir took part in The GLEE Choir competition at the Brunton Theatre. Our P6s and P7s took part in The Mock Court Case Project. They worked extremely hard to build and present their cases in Edinburgh Sheriff Court and came second in Scotland. Last session we were selected to be a School of Rugby. Learners have the opportunity to take part in drumming sessions and also learn to play the ukulele.

Prepare for winter



With the presence of Coronavirus (Covid-19), it's more important than ever to get the flu vaccine to protect yourself, others and the NHS. Seasonal flu is serious. NHS Scotland recommend you have the free flu vaccine if you are aged 65 or over (by 31 March 2021), have an eligible health condition or live in the same household as someone who is in the high risk category. Vaccination for the different groups begin as soon as the necessary supply of vaccine becomes available.

Vaccines are available at GP surgeries and community pharmacies, although this may be changed depending on demand as shown with the pandemic. Community centres, halls, etc. may be utilized for walk in clinics should the need arise. If you're 16 yrs. or older and not eligible for the flu vaccine, you can get the vaccine in many community pharmacies for a small fee.

It's important you recognise flu symptoms:

High fever- above 37.8c, aches, dry cough, tiredness or exhaustion and headache. Prevention is far better than risking your life or others around you.

Our 24hr Publicly Accessible Defibrillator is on the wall outside Rosewell Primary School. In the event of a heart attack the response will be quicker if you have familiarized yourself with instructions beforehand.

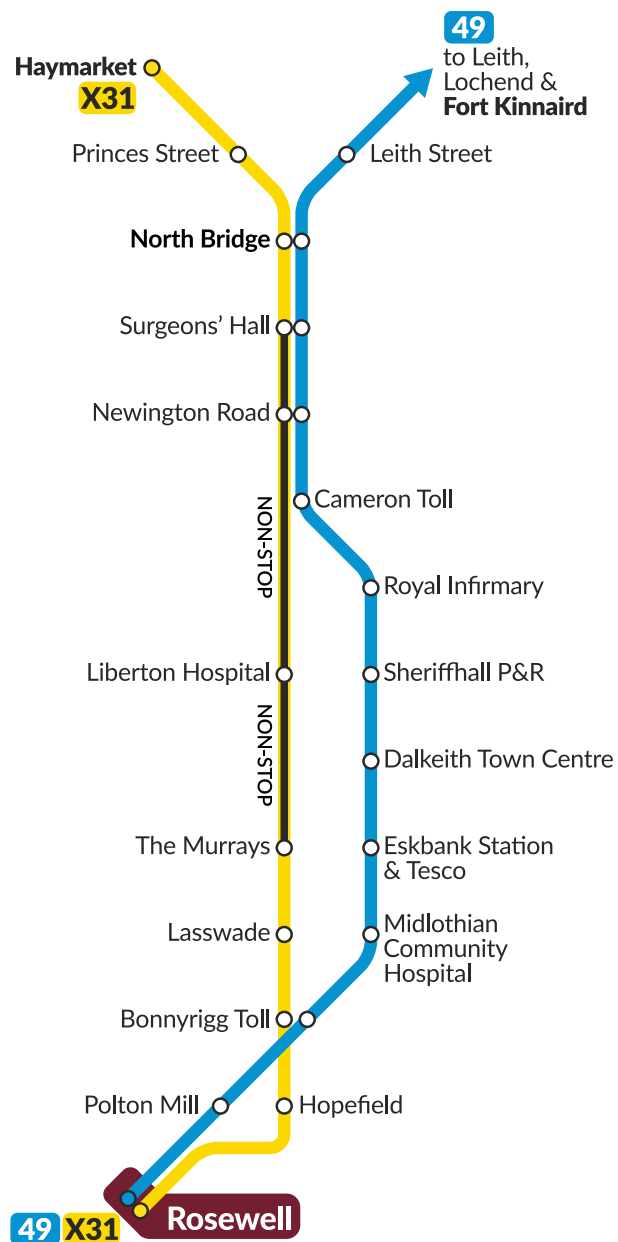

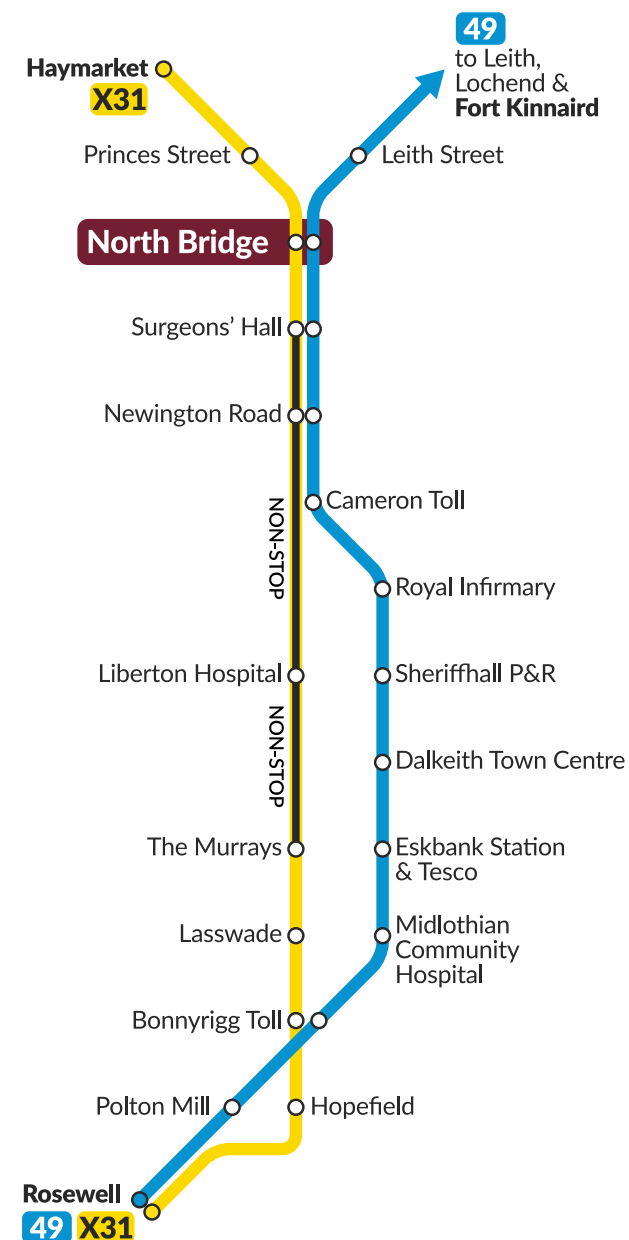
