

Between 15th April and 30 May 2019 in the beat areas MW02, MW05 & MS04 – Rosewell & District – there were 7 crimes recorded, with 2 solved.

Incidents of Note

- About 5pm on the 30 April at Whitehill Golf Course a dog which was not on a lead attacked another dog causing minor injury. The owner of the offending dog was issued with a warning from the Midlothian Dog Warden.
- Sometime on the 30 April, a tradesman left a bag containing £1500-£2000 worth of tools at the gate of the Avant Homes building site. On returning to collect it, it had gone presumed to have been stolen.
- On the 6 May at a property of Victoria Street, a male unknown to the occupier walked into the property and began asking questions. He was described as white/tanned skin, 5ft 7, in his 60s, outgrown dark greasy hair, wearing brown trousers and a dark top.
- Between 5.30pm on the 7 May and 7:15am on the 8 May, a white Ford Transit van on Cochrina Place was broken into and tools stolen from within. Enquiries ongoing.
- At 8.30pm on the 11 May at Rosedale Cemetery, a 22 year old male was issued with a Recorded Police Warning for being in possession of a small amount of Cannabis.
- On the 19 May at the A6094 a vehicle was seized for having no valid insurance.
