

POLICE REPORT, DECEMBER 2018 – JANUARY 2019
BEAT AREA MW02, MW05 & MS04 – ROSEWELL & DISTRICT

During the months of December 2018 – 15th January 2019 in the beat areas MW02, MW05 & MS04 – Rosewell & District – there were 4 crimes recorded, with 0 solved.

During this time period, there were 52 calls to Police Scotland.

Incidents of Note

- About 9am on 5/12/18 police were notified of a car that had skidded on ice and came to rest in a ditch near to the entrance of Whitehill House Golf Club. No one was injured and Midlothian Council were contacted in order to have the road treated with grit.
- About 7am on 15/12/18 it was discovered that a car parked on Carnethie Street, Rosewell had its tyres slashed by an unknown person.
- About 2.20pm on 18/12/2018 police were called to a road traffic collision between two cars on the A6094 near to Crossroads Cottage, Rosewell. The drivers both suffered minor injury and no offences detected.
- About 10.30am on 2/01/2019 police were called to A6094 near to Rosslynlee Trout Fishery regarding a report of a car having skidded off the roadway. Police attended with no one found to have sustained any injuries and no offences detected.
