



**POLICE REPORT, OCTOBER - NOVEMBER 2018**  
**BEAT AREA MW02, MW05 & MS04 – ROSEWELL & DISTRICT**



During the month of February 2019 in the beat areas MW02, MW05 & MS04 – Rosewell & District – there were 8 crimes recorded, with 5 solved.

During this time period, there were 43 calls to Police Scotland.

**Incidents of Note**

- About 6.30pm on 1/02/2019 police attended the woodland classroom near Thornton Road, Rosewell, with regards to youths making noise and concerns about damage. The youths were moved on and no crimes committed.
- About 1.00am on the 03/02/2019, there was a report of suspect males trying to gain entry to the building site at Hawthornden. Police attended and males had gone, no damage or insecurities found.
- About 10.45pm on 6/02/2019 police stopped and searched a vehicle on Louisa Square, Rosewell and issued a 21 year old female and 20 year old male with a Recorded Police Warning for possession of drugs.
- On the 08/02/2019 a 34 year old male was issued with a fixed penalty and points on his licence for driving with no insurance.
- On the 08/02/2019 at Hawthornden Cemetery headstones were knocked down by unknown suspects. Enquiries are ongoing to trace those responsible.
- On the 19/02/2019 at the B703 a cyclist came into contact with a vehicle attempting to overtake dangerously. There were no injuries, and police enquiries are ongoing to trace the driver of the vehicle.
