

# Police Report, June – August 2019 Beat Area MW02, MW05 & MS04 – Rosewell & District



During the months of June to August 2019 in the beat areas MW02, MW05 & MS04 – Rosewell & District – there were 18 crimes recorded, with 11 solved.

During this time period, there were 92 calls to Police Scotland.

### **Incidents of Note**

- On 28<sup>th</sup> June 2019 at Kinlouch Crescent, Rosewell a male was found to be in possession of cannabis and issued with a recorded police warning.
- On 2<sup>nd</sup> July 2019 at Rosewell Court, Rosewell, there was a report of a
  possible bogus worker doing gardening work. Insufficient evidence to
  establish if a crime had been committed.
- About 8:40 am 7<sup>th</sup> July 2019 there was a 2-vehicle collision at Carnethie Street, Rosewell. No injuries and no offences were detected.
- About 9:30 pm 7<sup>th</sup> July 2019 near to Rosslynlee Hospital a vehicle was stopped by police. Whilst being checked by officers the vehicle made off. The driver was later traced and charged with dangerous driving, driving whilst disqualified, failing to stop and having no insurance.
- About 10 pm, 9<sup>th</sup> July a suspect person was reported for trying doors at an address in Carnethie Street, Rosewell.
- Overnight 18<sup>th</sup> into 19<sup>th</sup> July 2019 a car had a wing mirror kicked off outside an address on Carnethie Street, Rosewell.
- About 3:10 pm 23<sup>rd</sup> July 2019 there was a two-vehicle collision in Carnethie Street, Rosewell. There were two minor injuries.
- About 2pm 2<sup>nd</sup> August 2019 a farm machinery was being towed on the A6094 when it overturned. The road was blocked for a period of time and no injuries reported.
- About 6pm on 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2019 there was a theft of keys from within an insecure property near to Rosslynlee hospital. The perpetrator was found by police nearby and arrested.
- Overnight on 7<sup>th</sup> August 2019 outside an address in Lindsay Circus, Rosewell a front number plate was stolen from a vehicle.
- Overnight on 15<sup>th</sup> August 2019 power tools were stolen from a vehicle in Gorton Place, Rosewell.
- Between 1:30 pm on 16<sup>th</sup> August 2019 and 10 pm on 17<sup>th</sup> August 2019 several hoax calls were made to ambulance and police from the phone box on Prestonhall Crescent. It is suspected that youths are responsible for these calls.
- About 6:20 pm 24<sup>th</sup> August 2019 at a field near to Thornton Farm, Rosewell, three males were seen attempting to remove a horse. One male was traced a short time later, arrested and charged with theft.
