

POLICE REPORT, MARCH AND APRIL 2019 BEAT AREA MW02, MW05 & MS04 - ROSEWELL & DISTRICT



Between 5th March and 15th April 2019 in the beat areas MW02, MW05 & MS04 – Rosewell & District – there were 8 crimes recorded, with 6 solved.

Incidents of Note

- Overnight 17th to 18th March 2018 a slip in theft occurred at an address in Prestonhall Crescent. Items were stolen along with a car. The vehicle was recovered and the person responsible identified through enquiry and reported accordingly.
- On 18th March 2018 at Lothian Street a male was issued with a recorded police warning following a disturbance.
- About 12:10 on 20th March police stopped a vehicle on the Rosewell bypass as the driver was not wearing a seatbelt. When checks were carried out it was found the driver was not insured, was driving on a provisional licence without supervision and had taken the car without the owner's permission. Charged and reported accordingly.
- On 4th April a window was smashed in Prestonhall Crescent. No persons seen.
- About 8 pm on Saturday 13th April in a field near to Kirkettle Farm, Rosewell a sheep was attacked by Staffordshire terrier type dog. The sheep was euthanised as a result of the attack. Enquiries are continuing to trace the owner

On the weekend of 23rd and 24th March Community Police Officers carried out speed and road checks in the Rosewell area including Carnethie Street. No speeding offences detected and one vehicle was seized as it was uninsured. Officers intend to continue these checks in a regular basis.
