



POLICE REPORT, SEPTEMBER 2019
BEAT AREA MW02, MW05 & MS04 – ROSEWELL & DISTRICT



During the month of September 2019 in the beat areas MW02, MW05 & MS04 – Rosewell & District – there were 2 crimes recorded, with 2 solved.

During this time period there were 30 calls to Police Scotland.

Incidents of Note

- On 5/9/19 at Carnethie Street, Rosewell a 36 year old female was issued with a Recorded Police Warning for abusive behaviour.
- About 11.30pm on 27/9 and again on 1.30am on 28/7 police were called with reports of fireworks being set off in the area of Carnethie Street, Rosewell.
