

From 26<sup>th</sup> November 2019 to 19<sup>th</sup> January 2020 in the beat areas MW02, MW05 & MS04 – Rosewell & District – there were 11 crimes recorded, with 5 solved.

During this time period there were 45 calls to Police Scotland.

### **Incidents of Note**

- About 01:15 hours, on 4<sup>th</sup> December 2019, at an address in Villa Dean, Rosewell, a suspect male was seen on a private CCTV system trying the boot of a vehicle.
- About 20:30 hours, 5<sup>th</sup> December 2019 at Fairlee Grove, Rosewell, a vehicle struck and damaged a fence. The driver then drove off. Police traced the driver a short time later. He was charged with drink driving and other road traffic offences.
- Between 9<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> December 2019 in Whitehill Road, Rosewell a vehicle was vandalised by scratching with a sharp object.
- Between 05:45 hours and 15:15 hours, on 11<sup>th</sup> December 2019, at an address in Louisa Square, Rosewell, a shed was broken into and a pedal cycle stolen.
- On 7<sup>th</sup> January 2020 Police approached a male in Louisa Square, Roswell, to discuss a matter with him. The male was seen to discard a small bag containing cannabis. The male was charged accordingly.

### **Community Police information**

Operation Frankincense ran throughout the month of December where local officers proactively targeted drunk/drug driving and other road traffic offences, violent crimes and crimes of dishonesty.
