

POLICE REPORT JUNE & JULY 2022 BEAT AREA MW05 – ROSEWELL & DISTRICT



Between 1st of July 2022 and the 31 of July 2022 2022 in the beat area MW05 – Rosewell & District – There were 62 calls to Police, 16 Crimes recorded of which 8 have been solved.

Incidents of Note

At 1950 hours on Wednesday the 1st of June 2022, Police were called to a disturbance at Rosewell convenience Store, Prestonhall Road, Rosewell, where a male had racially abused and assaulted staff members, vandalised the store and stolen items. A 16 year old male was charged with 5x offences in relation to the matter and a report was submitted to the procurator fiscal.

At 1945 hours, Wednesday the 8th of June 2022, Police received a report of Youths within the Avant Construction site near to Shiel Hall Grove. All youths made off on Police arrival. At 1830 hours, Friday the 10th of June 2022, Police Received a further report of two youths in the construction site. 1x Window was found to have been smashed within the site. Crime Report has been submitted for Vandalism. Police enquiries are still ongoing. PC Lennox has contacted AVANT and asked for all Fencing to be re secured to prevent further offenses within the site.

On Monday the 13th of June, 2022, Police received a report of Youths in possession of Petrol attempting to light fires. Police promptly attended however no youths were traced.

About 1455 hours, Community Officers observed a Silver Seat Ibiza driving suspiciously. Police checks established the vehicle had no valid insurance. A 29 Year old female was charged with Driving without valid car insurance and reported to the procurator fiscal.

On Thursday the 30th of June 2022, Police received a report of youths throwing bricks at buses, smashing the bus window. Police enquiry has identified a 15 year old male as being responsible for smashing the window. A Report has been submitted to the Youth Justice Officer.

On the Morning of the 4th of July 2022, Police received reports of spray paint at Louisa Square and Greenside Place with the tag 'RNS'. Police Enquiry's are still ongoing.

Lothian buses Joint Patrols

From the 18th of July 2022, PC Lennox Launched a Joint initiative with Midlothian Police and Lothian Buses to target antisocial behaviour, due to numerous reports of Youths being abusive on buses to patrons and staff, vandalising the buses (inc on 30th of June), fire raisings on the buses and at the bus terminus and assaults. Particular attention has been on the No.49 bus, which covers the Rosewell Area.

These initiatives have involved both HI-Visibility and Pain Clothed details, many with personnel from Lothian buses. So far numerous youths have been engaged with appropriate advice given. Midlothian CPT will continue these patrols for the rest of the summer holidays to prevent anti-social behaviour.
