## POLICE REPORT DECEMBER 2022 BEAT AREA MW05 – ROSEWELL & DISTRICT



Between 1<sup>st</sup> of December to the 31<sup>st</sup> December 2022 in the beat area MW05, there was 22 calls made to police. There was only 1 crime recorded which was solved!

# **INCIDENTS OF NOTE**

- At 1645 hours on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of December 2022, Police received a report of Youths damaging the Bus Terminal on Carnethie Street, Rosewell. Officers from the Midlothian Community Action Team attended, however there was no youths traced. There was no visible damage to the bus terminus noted at that time. About 1900 hours, same date, a further call was received reporting 4 to 5 youths fighting on Carnethie Street. The community Action Team attended the area, however, no youths were traced.
- About 1500 hours, 24<sup>th</sup> of December 2022, Police Received a call of a deer on the side of the road. On Officer arrival, only the head and Hide were present. The Lothian and Borders Wildlife Officer was called, however, due to a lack of the animal being present, no Post Mortem could take place to determine the cause of death. Due to this, no Crime Report was submitted. If anyone has any further details on this incident, please call 101 and quote inc 2214.
- 1) Midlothian Police has received an increase In the use of anti-social off road motor bikes and Quad Bikes. Midlothian Community Action Team are gathering intel on this and there are plans to target this in the near future.
