

POLICE REPORT JANUARY 2022 TO FEBRUARY 2022 BEAT AREA MW05 – ROSEWELL & DISTRICT



Between 13th January 2022 and 27th February 2022 in the beat area MW05 – Rosewell & District – There were 9 crimes recorded, with 1 solved to date for the Rosewell area.

Incidents of Note

- About 7.20pm on 17/01/2022 Police were called to Shiel Hall Square, Rosewell, after a report of a car speeding in the area. Police attended in the area and provided attention with no trace of any speeding vehicles.
- About 7.05pm on 19/02/2022 Police were called to a local shop on Prestonhall Road, Rosewell after a group of youths entered and stole a quantity of alcohol. Police enquiries are ongoing.
- About 9.45pm on 25/01/2022 police were called to the children's park, Villa Dean, Rosewell after a report youths had lit a small fire. Police and Fire Service attended. Small fire made up of rubbish was extinguished with no trace of any youths.
- About 12.40am on 14/2/2022 Police were called to Carnethie Street, Rosewell after a 13 year old boy was found to be intoxicated. Police attended and conveyed the boy home.
- About 6pm on 26/2/2022 Police were called to Carnethie Street, Rosewell after a report of youths causing issues in the area. Police attended and traced a group of youths. No crimes were detected and the youths were warned regarding their conduct.
